That §§ 24.2-405, 24.2-406 and 24.2-418 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as 12 13 follows: 14 § 24.2-405. Persons who may obtain lists of registered voters. 15 The State Board shall furnish, at a reasonable price, lists of registered voters for their districts to (i) 16 courts of the Commonwealth and the United States for jury selection purposes, (ii) candidates for election or political party nomination to further their candidacy, (iii) political party committees or 17 officials thereof for political purposes only, (iv) incumbent officeholders to report to their constituents, 18 19 and (v) nonprofit organizations which promote voter participation and registration for that purpose only. 20 The lists shall be furnished to no one else and used for no other purpose, except that the State Board is 21 authorized to furnish information from the voter registration system to general registrars for their official 22 use. 23 In no event shall any list furnished under this section contain the social security number of any 24 registered voter except a list furnished to a court of the Commonwealth or of the United States for jury 25 selection purposes. 26 Any list furnished under this section shall contain the post office box address in lieu of the residence 27 street address for any active or retired law-enforcement officer, as defined in § 9-169 and in 5 U.S.C.A. 28 § 8331 (20) but excluding officers whose duties relate to detention as defined in paragraphs (A) through 29 (D) of § 8331 (20), who has furnished at the time of registration or subsequently, in addition to his 30 street address, a post office box address for his residence for use on such lists. 31 Any printed precinct list furnished under this section shall contain the post office box address in lieu 32 of the residence street address for any party granted a protective order as described in §§ 16.1-253.1, 33 16.1-253.4, 16.1-279.1, and 18.2-60.3, who has furnished at the time of registration or subsequently, in 34 addition to his street address, a post office box address for his residence for use on such lists. 35 § 24.2-406. Persons who may obtain lists of persons voting at primaries and elections. 36 The State Board shall furnish to candidates, elected officials, or political party chairmen and to no 37 one else, on request and at a reasonable price, lists for their districts of persons who voted at any 38 primary or general election held in the two preceding years. Such lists shall be used only for campaign 39 and political purposes and for reporting to constituents. 40 In no event shall any list furnished under this section contain the social security number of any registered voter. 41 42 Any list furnished under this section shall contain the post office box address in lieu of the residence street address for any active or retired law-enforcement officer, as defined in § 9-169 and in 5 U.S.C.A. 43 § 8331 (20) but excluding officers whose duties relate to detention as defined in paragraphs (A) through 44 (D) of § 8331 (20), who has furnished at the time of registration or subsequently, in addition to his 45 street address, a post office box address for his residence for use on such lists. 46 47 Any printed precinct list furnished under this section shall contain the post office box address in lieu **48** of the residence street address for any party granted a protective order as described in §§ 16.1-253.1, 49 16.1-253.4, 16.1-279.1, and 18.2-60.3, who has furnished at the time of registration or subsequently, in 50 addition to his street address, a post office box address for his residence for use on such lists. 51 § 24.2-418. Application for registration. 52 Each applicant to register shall provide, subject to felony penalties for making false statements 53 pursuant to § 24.2-1016, the information necessary to complete the application to register. Unless 54 physically disabled, he shall sign the application. The application to register shall be only on a form or 55 forms prescribed by the State Board. The form of the application to register shall require the applicant to provide the following 56 information: full name, including the maiden name and any other prior legal name; age; gender; date 57 and place of birth; social security number, if any; whether the applicant is presently a United States 58 citizen; address and place of abode and date of residence in the precinct; place of any previous 59

registrations to vote; and whether the applicant has ever been adjudicated to be mentally incompetent or 60

- convicted of a felony, and if so, under what circumstances the applicant's right to vote has been 61 62 restored.
- 63 The form shall permit any active or retired law-enforcement officer, as defined in § 9-169 and in 5
- 64 U.S.C.A. § 8331 (20) but excluding officers whose duties relate to detention as defined in paragraphs
- 65 (A) through (D) of § 8331 (20), to furnish, in addition to his residence street address, a post office box address for his residence to be included in lieu of his street address on the lists of registered voters and 66
- 67 persons who voted which are furnished pursuant to §§ 24.2-405 and 24.2-406.
- The form shall permit any party granted a protective order as described in §§ 16.1-253.1, 16.1-253.4, 16.1-279.1 and 18.2-60.3 to furnish, in addition to his street address, a post office box 68 69 address for his residence to be included in lieu of his street address on the lists of registered voters and 70
- persons who voted which are furnished pursuant to §§ 24.2-405 and 24.2-406. 71
- [2. That the amendments enacted by this act shall be implemented on or before January 1, 1997. 72 73
