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13 14	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That § 58.1-4006 and 58.1-4007 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows:
15	§ 58.1-4006. Powers of the Director.
16	A. The Director shall supervise and administer the operation of the lottery in accordance with the
17	provisions of this chapter and with the rules and regulations promulgated hereunder.
18	B. The Director shall also:
19 20	1. Employ such deputy directors, professional, technical and clerical assistants, and other employees as may be required to carry out the functions and duties of the Department.
21 22	 Act as secretary and executive officer of the Board. Require bond from licensed agents as provided in subsection D of § 58.1-4009 and Department

2 4	and regulations of the Board. The Director may also require bond from other employees as he deems
25	necessary.
26	4. Confer at least once every month with the Board on the operation and administration of the
27	lottery; make available for inspection by the Board, upon request, all books, records, files, and other
28	information and documents of the Department; and advise the Board and recommend such matters as he
29 30	deems necessary and advisable to improve the operation and administration of the lottery.
30 31	5. Suspend, revoke or refuse to renew any license issued pursuant to this chapter or the rules and regulations adopted hereunder.
32	6. Enter into contracts for the operation of the lottery, or any part thereof, <i>and</i> for the promotion of
33	the lottery and into interstate lottery contracts with other states. A contract awarded or entered into by
34	the Director shall not be assigned by the holder thereof except by specific approval of the Director.
35	7. Certify monthly to the State Comptroller and the Board a full and complete statement of lottery
36	revenues, prize disbursements and other expenses for the preceding month.
37	8. Report monthly to the Governor, the Secretary of Finance and the Chairmen of the Senate Finance
38 39	Committee, House Finance Committee and House Appropriations Committee the total lottery revenues, prize disbursements and other expenses for the preceding month, and make an annual report, which shall
40	include a full and complete statement of lottery revenues, prize disbursements and other expenses, to the
41	Governor and the General Assembly. Such annual report shall also include such recommendations for
42	changes in this chapter as the Director and Board deem necessary or desirable.
43	9. Report immediately to the Governor and the General Assembly any matters which require
44	immediate changes in the laws of this Commonwealth in order to prevent abuses and evasions of this

49	11. Provide for the withholding of the applicable amount of state and federal income tax of persons

51	C. The Director and the director of security or investigators appointed by the Director shall be vested
52	with the powers of sheriff and sworn to enforce the statutes and regulations pertaining to the Department
53 54	and to investigate violations of the statutes and regulations that the Director is required to enforce. 5.58 ± 4007 Decord
54 55	§ 58.1-4007. Powers of the Board. A. The Board shall have the power to adopt regulations governing the establishment and operation of
55 56	a lottery. The regulations governing the establishment and operation of the lottery shall be promulgated
57	by the Board after consultation with the Director. Except as provided in § 58.1-4028, such regulations
58	shall be in accordance with the Administrative Process Act (§ 9-6.14:1 et seq.). The regulations shall
59	provide for all matters necessary or desirable for the efficient, honest and economical operation and

administration of the lottery and for the convenience of the purchasers of tickets or shares, and the
holders of winning tickets or shares. The regulations, which may be amended, repealed or supplemented
as necessary, shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

63 1. The type or types of lottery to be conducted, which shall not include "keno" or any interstate 64 lottery games.

2. The price or prices of tickets or shares in the lottery; however, all such sales shall be for cash.

3. The numbers and sizes of the prizes on the winning tickets or shares, including informing the
public of the approximate odds of winning and the proportion of lottery revenues (i) disbursed as prizes
and (ii) returned to the Commonwealth as net revenues.

4. The manner of selecting the winning tickets or shares.

5. The manner of payment of prizes to the holders of winning tickets or shares.

6. The frequency of the drawings or selections of winning tickets or shares without limitation, which,
except for instant games where the winner is determined immediately upon playing, shall be limited to
no more than once a day.

74 7. Without limitation as to number, the type or types of locations at which tickets or shares may be sold.

8. The method to be used in selling tickets or shares.

9. The advertisement of the lottery in accordance with the provisions of subsection E of § 58.1-4022.

10. The licensing of agents to sell tickets or shares who will best serve the public convenience and
promote the sale of tickets or shares. No person under the age of eighteen shall be licensed as an agent.
A licensed agent may employ a person who is sixteen years of age or older to sell or otherwise vend
tickets at the agent's place of business so long as the employee is supervised in the selling or vending of
tickets by the manager or supervisor in charge at the location where the tickets are being sold.
Employment of such person shall be in compliance with Chapter 5 (§ 40.1-78 et seq.) of Title 40.1.

84 11. The manner and amount of compensation, if any, to be paid licensed sales agents necessary to
85 provide for the adequate availability of tickets or shares to prospective buyers and for the convenience
86 of the public.

87 12. Apportionment of the total revenues accruing from the sale of tickets or shares and from all other
88 sources and establishment of the amount of the special reserve fund as provided in § 58.1-4022 of this chapter.

90 13. Such other matters necessary or desirable for the efficient and economical operation and
 91 administration of the lottery.

92 The Board shall also promulgate regulations, after consultation with the Director, relative to 93 departmental procurement which include standards of ethics for procurement consistent with the 94 provisions of Article 4 (§ 11-72 et seq.) of Chapter 7 of Title 11 and which ensure that departmental 95 procurement will be based on competitive principles.

96 The Board shall have the power to advise and recommend, but shall have no power to veto or modify administrative decisions of the Director.

98 B. The Board shall carry on a continuous study and investigation of the lottery throughout the99 Commonwealth to:

100 1. Ascertain any defects of this chapter or the regulations issued hereunder which cause abuses in the administration and operation of the lottery and any evasions of such provisions.

102 2. Formulate, with the Director, recommendations for changes in this chapter and the regulations103 promulgated hereunder to prevent such abuses and evasions.

104 3. Guard against the use of this chapter and the regulations promulgated hereunder as a subterfuge105 for organized crime and illegal gambling.

4. Ensure that this law and the regulations of the Board are in such form and are so administered asto serve the true purpose of this chapter.

108 C. The Board shall make a continuous study and investigation of (i) the operation and the administration of similar laws which may be in effect in other states or countries, (ii) any literature on the subject which may be published or available, (iii) any federal laws which may affect the operation of the lottery, and (iv) the reaction of Virginia citizens to the potential features of the lottery with a view to recommending or effecting changes that will serve the purpose of this chapter.

113 D. The Board shall hear and decide an appeal of any denial by the Director of the licensing or 114 revocation of a license of a lottery agent pursuant to subdivision 10 of subsection A of this section and 115 subdivision 5 of subsection B of § 58.1-4006 of this chapter.

E. The Board shall have the authority to initiate procedures for planning, acquisition, and construction of capital projects as set forth in Article 6 (§ 2.1-224 et seq.) of Chapter 14 and Article 5 (§ 2.1-480 et seq.) of Chapter 32 of Title 2.1.

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
