10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11 12	1. That § 17-41 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 17-41. Clerks' offices to be kept open on certain days. The clerk's office of every court shall be kept open on every day except Sunday, and the days
14	provided for in § 2.1-21, for the transaction of business; provided that:
15	1. The judge of any circuit court may authorize the clerk to close the office on Saturday at twelve
16	o'clock noon;
17	2. The judge of the circuit court of any county or city may authorize the clerk to close the office on
18	Saturday, provided the governing body of such county or city approves such action as evidenced by a
19	resolution adopted by such governing body;
20	3. The judge of any court in any county or city may authorize the clerk of such court to close the
21	office on Saturday, provided the governing body of such county or city approves such action as
22	evidenced by a resolution adopted by such governing body;
23 24	4. Notwithstanding the provisions of 2 and 3 hereof, the office of any clerk which has been closed on Saturday, pursuant to law, prior to July 1, 1962, may remain closed on Saturday;
24 25	5. The clerk's office of the circuit court of any county or city may be closed on any day which is
<b>2</b> 6	established as a general holiday for the employees of such county or city by a resolution duly adopted
27	by the governing body of such county or city and approved by the judge of the circuit court and filed in
28	the office of such clerk; provided, however, that such general holiday shall have the same force and
29	effect as a legal holiday as set forth in § 1-13.3:1;
30	6. The judge of any court in any county or city may authorize the clerk of such court to close the
31	clerk's office on Christmas Eve; provided, however, that the closing of any clerk's office as provided by
32	this section shall have the same force and effect as a legal holiday as set forth in § 1-13.3:1;
33 24	7. The chief judge or presiding judge of any circuit court may authorize the clerk of the court to
34 35	close the clerk's office on any day when the chief judge or presiding judge determines that operation of the clerk's office, under prevailing conditions, would constitute a threat to the health and safety of the
33 36	clerk's office personnel or the general public. Closing of the clerk's office pursuant to this subdivision
37	shall have the same effect as provided in § 1-13.3:1-;
38	8. The chief judge or presiding judge of the circuit court in any county or city may authorize the
39	closing of the circuit court and may authorize the clerk of such court to close the clerk's office when the
40	[ district court or ] district court clerk's office in that county or city is closed. Closing of the court or
41	the clerk's office pursuant to this subdivision shall have the same effect as provided in § 1-13.3:1.
42	Except for closings pursuant to subdivision 7, whenever the authorization of the judge is necessary to
43	close a clerk's office and a clerk is the clerk of more than one court, or a court has more than one
44 45	judge, the authorization of all such judges shall be necessary. The judge of the circuit court of any county or city may require the clerk's office to be kept open
<b>46</b>	continuously for the transaction of business during convenient hours on all the days on which it is
47	herein required to be kept open.

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
