6	A BILL to amend and reenact § 17-41 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the closing of the clerk's
7	office of a court.
8 9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That § 17-41 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
10	§ 17-41. Clerks' offices to be kept open on certain days.
11	The clerk's office of every court shall be kept open on every day except Sunday, and the days
12	provided for in § 2.1-21, for the transaction of business; provided that:
13 14	1. The judge of any circuit court may authorize the clerk to close the office on Saturday at twelve
14	o'clock noon; 2. The judge of the circuit court of any county or city may authorize the clerk to close the office on
16	Saturday, provided the governing body of such county or city approves such action as evidenced by a
17	resolution adopted by such governing body;
18 19	3. The judge of any court in any county or city may authorize the clerk of such court to close the office on Saturday, provided the governing body of such county or city approves such action as
20	evidenced by a resolution adopted by such governing body;
21	4. Notwithstanding the provisions of 2 and 3 hereof, the office of any clerk which has been closed
22 23	on Saturday, pursuant to law, prior to July 1, 1962, may remain closed on Saturday; 5. The clerk's office of the circuit court of any county or city may be closed on any day which is
23 24	established as a general holiday for the employees of such county or city by a resolution duly adopted
25	by the governing body of such county or city and approved by the judge of the circuit court and filed in
26	the office of such clerk; provided, however, that such general holiday shall have the same force and
27 28	effect as a legal holiday as set forth in § 1-13.3:1; 6. The judge of any court in any county or city may authorize the clerk of such court to close the
29	clerk's office on Christmas Eve; provided, however, that the closing of any clerk's office as provided by
30	this section shall have the same force and effect as a legal holiday as set forth in § 1-13.3:1;
31 32	7. The chief judge or presiding judge of any circuit court may authorize the clerk of the court to close the clerk's office on any day when the chief judge or presiding judge determines that operation of
32 33	the clerk's office, under prevailing conditions, would constitute a threat to the health and safety of the
34	clerk's office personnel or the general public. Closing of the clerk's office pursuant to this subdivision
35	shall have the same effect as provided in § 1-13.3:1-;
36 37	8. The judge of the circuit court of any county or city may authorize the clerk of such court to close the clerk's office on any day or portion of a day which the Governor declares as a holiday for state
38	employees, or on any day or portion of a day on which the Governor authorizes state offices to be
39	closed; provided, that such closing of any clerk's office shall have the same force and effect as a legal
40 41	<i>holiday as set forth in § 1-13.3:1.</i> Except for closings pursuant to subdivision 7, whenever the authorization of the judge is necessary to
42	close a clerk's office and a clerk is the clerk of more than one court, or a court has more than one
43	judge, the authorization of all such judges shall be necessary.
44 45	The judge of the circuit court of any county or city may require the clerk's office to be kept open
45 46	continuously for the transaction of business during convenient hours on all the days on which it is herein required to be kept open.
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
