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## VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 2.1-738 of the Code of Virginia, relating to claims to the Department of 3 Veterans' Affairs.

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## Approved

#### Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 6

7 1. That § 2.1-738 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 8

§ 2.1-738. General powers and duties of Director.

9 The Director shall establish, equip, and operate such offices as may be necessary or desirable to 10 render assistance to veterans of the armed forces of the United States and their Virginia-domiciled surviving spouses, orphans, and dependents in matters of rehabilitation and in the preparation, 11 presentation, and prosecution of all lawful claims, by, or on behalf of, such veterans and their surviving 12 13 spouses, orphans, and dependents, to obtain the benefit of their rights and privileges under various 14 federal, state, and local laws enacted for their benefit. However, after an original claim has been 15 disallowed by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, the Director may cancel a veteran's power of attorney to the Virginia Department of Veterans Affairs and discontinue representation of that veteran 16 17 when, in the Director's judgment, the claim is not a lawful one. For the purposes of this section, "lawful 18 claim" means a claim which, to the best of the claimant's knowledge, information and belief, formed 19 after reasonable inquiry, is well-grounded in fact and is warranted by existing law or is a good faith 20 argument for the extension, modification or reversal of existing law related to the application of such 21 claimant's right or privilege.

22 For these purposes The Director is authorized to employ such personnel as in his judgment may be 23 necessary for the proper operation of such offices and for the proper discharge of the duties and 24 functions of such Department.

25 Such offices shall be so located as to make the services of the Department conveniently available to 26 such veterans and their surviving spouses, orphans, and dependents. Appropriate geographic areas of 27 responsibility shall be assigned from time to time for each office. The various localities in each such area shall be visited by a representative attached to the office having responsibility for the area at such 28 29 intervals as may be necessary or desirable.

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
