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**HOUSE BILL NO. 686**

Offered January 19, 1996

*A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 4.1-208 and 4.1-209 of the Code of Virginia, and to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered 4.1-220.1, relating to alcoholic beverage control; wine and beer licenses.*

**Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:**

**1. That §§ 4.1-208 and 4.1-209 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding §4.1-220.1 as follows:**

§ 4.1-208. Beer licenses.

The Board may grant the following licenses relating to beer:

1. Brewery licenses, which shall authorize the licensee to manufacture beer and to sell and deliver or ship the beer so manufactured, in accordance with Board regulations, in closed containers to (i) persons licensed to sell the beer at wholesale, (ii) persons licensed to sell beer at retail for the purpose of resale, only as provided in subdivision B 4 of § 4.1-216, (iii) owners of boats registered under the laws of the United States sailing for ports of call of a foreign country or another state and (iv) persons outside the Commonwealth for resale outside the Commonwealth.

2. Bottlers' licenses, which shall authorize the licensee to acquire and receive deliveries and shipments of beer in closed containers and to bottle, sell and deliver or ship it, in accordance with Board regulations to (i) wholesale beer licensees for the purpose of resale, (ii) owners of boats registered under the laws of the United States sailing for ports of call of a foreign country or another state and (iii) persons outside the Commonwealth for resale outside the Commonwealth.

3. Wholesale beer licenses, which shall authorize the licensee to acquire and receive deliveries and shipments of beer and to sell and deliver or ship it, in accordance with Board regulations, in closed containers to (i) persons licensed under this chapter to sell such beer at wholesale or retail for the purpose of resale, (ii) owners of boats registered under the laws of the United States sailing for ports of call of a foreign country or another state and (iii) persons outside the Commonwealth for resale outside the Commonwealth.

No wholesale beer licensee shall purchase beer for resale from a person outside the Commonwealth who does not hold a beer importer's license unless such wholesale beer licensee holds a beer importer's license and purchases beer for resale pursuant to the privileges of such beer importer's license.

4. Beer importers' licenses, which shall authorize persons licensed within or outside the Commonwealth to sell and deliver or ship beer into the Commonwealth, in accordance with Board regulations, in closed containers, to persons in the Commonwealth licensed to sell beer at wholesale for the purpose of resale.

5. Retail on-premises beer licenses to:

a. Hotels, restaurants and clubs, which shall authorize the licensee to sell beer, either with or without meals, only in dining areas and other designated areas of such restaurants, or in dining areas, private guest rooms, and other designated areas of such hotels or clubs, for consumption only in such rooms and areas.

b. Persons operating dining cars, buffet cars, and club cars of trains, which shall authorize the licensee to sell beer, either with or without meals, in the dining cars, buffet cars, and club cars so operated by them for on-premises consumption when carrying passengers.

c. Persons operating boats for which certificates as a sight-seeing carrier by boat, or a special or charter party by boat have been issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles pursuant to § 46.2-2607, which shall authorize the licensee to sell beer, either with or without meals, on such boats operated by them for on-premises consumption when carrying passengers.

d. Grocery stores located in any town or in a rural area outside the corporate limits of any city or town, which shall authorize the licensee to sell beer for on-premises consumption in such establishments. No license shall be granted unless it appears affirmatively that a substantial public demand for such licensed establishment exists and that public convenience and the purposes of this title will be promoted by granting the license.

e. Persons operating food concessions at coliseums, stadia, or similar facilities, which shall authorize the licensee to sell beer, in paper, plastic, or similar disposable containers, during the performance of professional sporting exhibitions, events or performances immediately subsequent thereto, to patrons

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60 within all seating areas, concourses, walkways, concession areas, and additional locations designated by  
61 the Board in such coliseums, stadia, or similar facilities, for on-premises consumption. Upon  
62 authorization of the licensee, any person may keep and consume his own lawfully acquired alcoholic  
63 beverages on the premises in all areas and locations covered by the license.

64 f. Persons operating food concessions at any outdoor performing arts amphitheater, arena or similar  
65 facility which has seating for more than 20,000 persons and is located in any county with a population  
66 between 210,000 and 216,000 or in any city with a population between 392,000 and 394,000. ~~Such~~  
67 *Except as provided in § 4.1-220.1, such* license shall authorize the licensee to sell beer during the  
68 performance of any event, in paper, plastic or similar disposable containers to patrons within all seating  
69 areas, concourses, walkways, concession areas, or similar facilities, for on-premises consumption. Upon  
70 authorization of the licensee, any person may keep and consume his own lawfully acquired alcoholic  
71 beverages on the premises in all areas and locations covered by the license.

72 6. Retail off-premises beer licenses, which shall authorize the licensee to sell beer in closed  
73 containers for off-premises consumption and to deliver or ship the beer to purchasers in accordance with  
74 Board regulations.

75 7. Retail on-and-off premises beer licenses to persons enumerated in subdivisions 5 a and d, which  
76 shall accord all the privileges conferred by retail on-premises beer licenses and in addition, shall  
77 authorize the licensee to sell beer in closed containers for off-premises consumption and to deliver or  
78 ship the beer to purchasers in accordance with Board regulations.

79 8. Gourmet brewing shop licenses, which shall authorize the licensee to sell to any person to whom  
80 beer may be lawfully sold, ingredients for brewing beer, including packaging, and to rent to such  
81 persons facilities for manufacturing, fermenting, and bottling such beer, for off-premises consumption in  
82 accordance with subdivision 6 of § 4.1-200.

83 § 4.1-209. Wine and beer licenses.

84 The Board may grant the following licenses relating to wine and beer:

85 1. Retail on-premises wine and beer licenses to:

86 a. Hotels, restaurants and clubs, which shall authorize the licensee to sell wine and beer, either with  
87 or without meals, only in dining areas and other designated areas of such restaurants, or in dining areas,  
88 private guest rooms, and other designated areas of such hotels or clubs, for consumption only in such  
89 rooms and areas. However, with regard to a hotel classified by the Board as a resort complex, the Board  
90 may authorize the sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages in all areas within the resort complex  
91 deemed appropriate by the Board;

92 b. Persons operating dining cars, buffet cars, and club cars of trains, which shall authorize the  
93 licensee to sell wine and beer, either with or without meals, in the dining cars, buffet cars, and club cars  
94 so operated by them, for on-premises consumption when carrying passengers;

95 c. Persons operating boats for which certificates as a sight-seeing carrier by boat, or a special or  
96 charter party by boat have been issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles pursuant to § 46.2-2607,  
97 which shall authorize the licensee to sell wine and beer, either with or without meals, on such boats  
98 operated by them for on-premises consumption when carrying passengers;

99 d. Persons operating as air carriers of passengers on regular schedules in foreign, interstate or  
100 intrastate commerce, which shall authorize the licensee to sell wine and beer for consumption by  
101 passengers in such airplanes anywhere in or over the Commonwealth while in transit and in designated  
102 rooms of establishments of such carriers at airports in the Commonwealth, § 4.1-129 notwithstanding;

103 e. Hospitals, which shall authorize the licensee to sell wine and beer in the rooms of patients for  
104 their on-premises consumption only in such rooms, provided the consent of the patient's attending  
105 physician is first obtained;

106 f. Persons operating food concessions at coliseums, stadia, or similar facilities, which shall authorize  
107 the licensee to sell wine and beer in paper, plastic or similar disposable containers, during the  
108 performance of professional sporting exhibitions, events or performances immediately subsequent thereto,  
109 to patrons within all seating areas, concourses, walkways, concession areas and additional locations  
110 designated by the Board in such coliseums, stadia or similar facilities, for on-premises consumption.  
111 Upon authorization of the licensee, any person may keep and consume his own lawfully acquired  
112 alcoholic beverages on the premises in all areas and locations covered by the license; and

113 g. Persons operating food concessions at any outdoor performing arts amphitheater, arena or similar  
114 facility which has seating for more than 20,000 persons and is located in any county with a population  
115 between 210,000 and 216,000 or in any city with a population between 392,000 and 394,000. ~~Such~~  
116 *Except as provided in § 4.1-220.1, such* license shall authorize the licensee to sell wine and beer during  
117 the performance of any event, in paper, plastic or similar disposable containers to patrons within all  
118 seating areas, concourses, walkways, concession areas, or similar facilities, for on-premises consumption.  
119 Upon authorization of the licensee, any person may keep and consume his own lawfully acquired  
120 alcoholic beverages on the premises in all areas and locations covered by the license.

121 2. Retail off-premises wine and beer licenses, which shall authorize the licensee to sell wine and beer

122 in closed containers for off-premises consumption and to deliver or ship the same to purchasers in  
123 accordance with Board regulations.

124 3. Gourmet shop licenses, which shall authorize the licensee to sell wine and beer in closed  
125 containers for off-premises consumption and, the provisions of § 4.1-308 notwithstanding, to give to any  
126 person to whom wine or beer may be lawfully sold, (i) a sample of wine, not to exceed one ounce by  
127 volume or (ii) a sample of beer not to exceed two ounces by volume, for on-premises consumption.

128 4. Convenience grocery store licenses, which shall authorize the licensee to sell wine and beer in  
129 closed containers for off-premises consumption.

130 5. Retail on-and-off premises wine and beer licenses to persons enumerated in subdivision 1 a, which  
131 shall accord all the privileges conferred by retail on-premises wine and beer licenses and in addition,  
132 shall authorize the licensee to sell wine and beer in closed containers for off-premises consumption and  
133 to deliver or ship the same to the purchasers, in accordance with Board regulations.

134 6. Banquet licenses to persons in charge of banquets, and to duly organized nonprofit corporations or  
135 associations in charge of special events, which shall authorize the licensee to sell or give wine and beer  
136 in rooms or areas approved by the Board for the occasion for on-premises consumption in such rooms  
137 or areas. A separate license shall be required for each day of each banquet or special event. However,  
138 no such license shall be required of any hotel, restaurant, or club holding a retail wine and beer license.

139 7. Gift shop licenses, which shall authorize the licensee to sell wine and beer unchilled, only within  
140 the interior premises of the gift shop in closed containers for off-premises consumption and to deliver or  
141 ship the wine and beer to purchasers in accordance with Board regulations.

142 § 4.1-220.1. *Limitations on certain beer, and wine and beer licensees.*

143 *Persons licensed pursuant to §§ 4.1-208 or 4.1-209 to operate food concessions at any outdoor*  
144 *performing arts amphitheater, arena or similar facility which has seating for more than 20,000 persons*  
145 *and is located in any county with a population between 210,000 and 216,000 shall sell beer or wine*  
146 *and beer only in designated areas which shall be accessible only to persons who may lawfully possess*  
147 *and consume alcoholic beverages and, in addition, such sales shall cease 90 minutes before the*  
148 *scheduled end of any event held at such facility.*
