A BILL to amend and reenact § 54.1-2729 of the Code of Virginia, relating to continuing education for dental hygienists.

11 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

12 1. That § 54.1-2729 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: § 54.1-2729. Continuing education.

A. The Board shall promulgate regulations governing continuing requirements for dental hygienists
licensed pursuant to this article. Such regulations shall require the completion of fifteen hours annually
in continuing education courses for any license renewal or reinstatement after April 1, 1995. The Board
may grant exemptions from these continuing education requirements.

18 B. The Board shall approve continuing education courses that are directly related to the practice of dental hygiene and the treatment and care of patients. Any licensed hospital, institution of higher 19 20 education, or national, state, or local health, medical, dental or dental hygiene organization, or 21 individuals thereof may submit applications to the Board for approval as a provider of continuing 22 education courses satisfying the requirements of the Board's regulations. Approved course providers must 23 register continuing education courses with the Board pursuant to Board regulations. Only courses 24 approved by the Board or offered by an approved provider may be designated as qualifying for 25 continuing education course credit.

C. All course providers shall furnish written certification to dental hygienists indicating the 26 27 satisfactory completion of an approved continuing education course, as evidenced by a post-course examination. Each course provider shall retain records of all persons attending and those persons 28 29 satisfactorily completing such continuing education courses for a period of four years following each 30 course. Applicants for renewal or reinstatement of licenses issued pursuant to this article shall retain for a period of four years the written certification issued by a course provider. The Board may require 31 32 course providers and licensees to submit copies of such records or certification as it deems necessary to 33 ensure compliance with continuing education requirements.
