HOUSE BILL NO. 845 House Amendments in [] — February 10, 1996 A BILL to amend and reenact § 10.1-1425.8 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the recycling of used motor oil and motor vehicle antifreeze. Patrons—Deeds; Senator: Trumbo Referred to Committee on Conservation and Natural Resources Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That § 10.1-1425.8 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: § 10.1-1425.8. Department of Transportation; authority and duty.

The Department of Transportation is authorized to conduct recycling research projects, including the establishment of demonstration projects which use recycled products in highway construction and maintenance. Such projects may include by way of example and not by limitation the use of ground rubber from used tires or glass for road surfacing, resurfacing and sub-base materials, as well as the use of plastic or mixed plastic materials for ground or guard rail posts, right-of-way fence posts and sign supports.

The Department of Transportation shall periodically review and revise its bid procedures and
specifications to encourage the use of products and materials with recycled content in its construction
and maintenance programs.

22 The Department of Transportation with the cooperation of the Department of Environmental Quality 23 shall [conduct a demonstration project at one of the Department of Transportation's maintenance area 24 offices in the County of Bath], subject to such conditions as may be determined by the 25 Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner [, for the collection of used motor oil and motor vehicle antifreeze from the general public. The used motor oil and motor vehicle antifreeze that are collected 26 27 shall be recycled or otherwise disposed of in accordance with programs and plans developed by the 28 Department of Environmental Quality under § 10.1-1425.6. Funds for this project shall be provided from 29 the selected county's Secondary Road construction allocations, not to exceed \$5,000 annually. This 30 demonstration project shall run] from July 1, 1993, to July 1, 1996 [until July 1, 1998]. The Department of Transportation, with the cooperation of the Department of Environmental Quality, shall 31 survey the counties, cities and towns of the Commonwealth to determine in which localities no 32 33 commercial facility for the collection of used motor oil and motor vehicle antifreeze exists. Following 34 such survey the Departments of Transportation and Environmental Quality shall identify the advantages 35 and disadvantages of making available to the public the currently existing [make available to the public 36 used oil and used motor vehicle antifreeze collection facilities at the Department of Transportation's 37 maintenance area offices in those localities where no commercial collection facilities exist.] The study 38 shall be completed and results reported to the 1996 Session of the General Assembly.

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
