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HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 125 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE (Proposed by the Senate Committee on Rules

on March 4, 1996)

(Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate Almand)

Expressing the sense of the General Assembly General Assembly that the Department of Medical Assistance Services request a waiver or waiver amendment to offer consumer-directed personal assistance services to Virginians who are elderly or who have disabilities in conjunction with the agency-directed model currently available.

WHEREAS, the Department of Medical Assistance Services has evaluated the feasibility and 10 advisability of amending the existing Elderly and Disabled Waiver to allow consumers to hire their own 11 personal attendant after demonstrating their ability to manage and supervise the performance of that 12 13 attendant; and

14 WHEREAS, the Department has the option to (i) continue to contract only with agencies for the 15 provision of personal care for other eligible clients; (ii) pay for services offered by individuals rather than agencies; or (iii) offer both options, which would be available based on the consumer's ability to 16 17 manage his own care: and

18 WHEREAS, the findings of the 1995 House Joint Resolution No. 539 study estimates that 1,176 19 consumers with disabilities who are under age 65 and 1,613 consumers over age 65 might choose the 20 option of consumer-directed personal assistance services, if available; and

21 WHEREAS, the implementation of the recommendations of the HJR 539 study appears to be 22 amenable to Congressional Medicaid reform; and

WHEREAS, the immediate benefit of consumer-directed personal assistance services includes an 23 24 increased level of independent living which is beneficial and productive for all Virginians; now, 25 therefore, be it

26 RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That it is the sense of the General 27 Assembly that the Department of Medical Assistance Services request a waiver or waiver amendment to 28 offer consumer-directed personal assistance services to Virginians who are elderly or who have 29 disabilities in conjunction with the agency-directed model currently available; and be it

30 RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Department of Medical Assistance Services be requested to study 31 existing and available waivers or other options to provide personal assistance services through 32 consumer-based model of service delivery. 33

All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Department, upon request.

34 The Department shall complete its work in time to submit its findings and recommendations by 35 November, 15, 1996, to the Governor and the 1997 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative 36 37 documents.
