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10	WHEREAS, the Juvenile and Domestic Relations District Court Law recognizes that certain
11	nondelinquent behavior can have serious consequences if not dealt with by the courts; and
12	WHEREAS, legislation has been enacted to deal with such nondelinquent behavior by provisions
13	concerning children in need of services, children in need of supervision, and status offenders; and
14	WHEREAS, law-enforcement personnel find that an ever-increasing amount of their time is spent
15	dealing with such children; and
16	WHEREAS, law-enforcement officers frequently find that they must remain out of service for
17	extended periods awaiting the juvenile's parent or guardian assuming custody of the juvenile; and
18	WHEREAS, the primary focus of the police officer is the enforcement of the criminal laws; and
19	WHEREAS, enhancing the ability of the courts to hold the juvenile and/or his or her parents
20	accountable for nondelinquent actions may indirectly reduce juvenile crime by enabling the courts to
21	ameliorate conditions which could lead to delinquent behavior; now, therefore, be it
22	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Department of Youth and
23	Family Services [, with the assistance and cooperation of the Office of the Attorney General, is directed
24	be requested] to examine all existing statutes directly related to children in need of services, children in
25	need of supervision, and status offenders, with particular emphasis on runaways and curfew violators,
26	and recommend revisions for both pre-dispositional and post-dispositional alternatives for the courts.

27 The Department of Youth and Family Services [and the Commission on Youth] shall complete its
28 work in time to submit its recommendations to the Governor and the 1997 Session of the General
29 Assembly as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the
30 processing of legislative documents.

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
