9	WHEREAS, substance abuse continues to devastate communities of color, especially the
10	African-American community disproportionately; and
11	WHEREAS, drug and alcohol addiction are not criminal justice issues but issues of mental, physical,
12	and spiritual health; and
13	WHEREAS, intravenous drug use has created dramatic increases in the transmission of HIV disease
14	in the African-American community, especially among women of child-bearing age and newborns; and
15	WHEREAS, the National Black Caucus of State Legislators, in a resolution adopted on December 2,
16	1995, encouraged all states to treat drug and alcohol addiction as a disease for the purposes of policy
17	development and priority-setting; now, therefore, be it
18	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That in developing policy for the
19	Commonwealth, drug and alcohol addiction should be addressed from the perspective of a disease model
20	rather than a criminal justice model; and, be it
21	RESOLVED FURTHER, That the General Assembly expresses its intent to support policies which
22	will give priority to the need of substance abuse treatment with the ultimate goal of providing treatment
23	on demand.
