11	month of fasting; and
12	WHEREAS, this sacred month of fasting represents the personal victory of men and women
13	worldwide over their unrestrained appetites and urges; and
14	WHEREAS, Eid-ul Fitr is the three-day celebration at the end of the fast of Ramadan that
15	commemorates this triumph over one's personal desires; and
16	WHEREAS, the Holy Qur'an, which was revealed by God to the Prophet Muhammad, is the spiritual
17	wellspring that inspires and guides all Muslim people; and
18	WHEREAS, Virginia's Muslim community has contributed greatly to the moral, social, economic,
19	and spiritual fabric of the Commonwealth; and
20	WHEREAS, it is only fitting that all Virginians be urged to take the time to understand and
21	recognize the piety and richness of the Muslim faith and its traditions; now, therefore, be it
22	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly [
23	designate recognize ] January 22 to February 20, 1996, as the Muslim Holy Month of Ramadan in
