13	WHEREAS, the Virginia Statute of Religious Freedom was enacted by the Virginia General
14 15	Assembly in 1786 to ensure the free expression of religious beliefs in the Commonwealth; and
15	WHEREAS, Virginians decry all acts of bigotry and hatred; and
16	WHEREAS, acts of bigotry, hatred, and violence against any particular people of faith threaten the
17	freedoms cherished by the citizens of this great Commonwealth; and
18	WHEREAS, recently, acts of violence were committed in Richmond against Keneseth Beth Israel, the
19	Glorious Church of God and Christ, the Metropolitan Community Church, Temple Beth El, and the
20	Young Israel of Richmond Synagogue; and
21 22	WHEREAS, all people should recognize that tolerance for others' beliefs and respect for others' opinions are the ingredients for peace; now, therefore, be it
23	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Virginia General Assembly
24	condemns the acts of bigotry and hatred perpetrated against these religious institutions and the people of
25	faith they represent; and, be it
26	RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Virginia General Assembly deplores the acts of biogtry, hatred,
27	violence, and intolerance, reaffirms its commitment to religious freedom and equality, and urges that
28	state and federal laws prohibiting such acts be aggressively enforced; and be it
29	RESOLVED FINALLY, That the Virginia General Assembly urge the citizens of the Commonwealth

to abide by the laws of the Commonwealth and this nation to ensure that the rights and privileges of all
persons are respected and protected and that peace and tranquillity prevail.
