HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 44

Commending Beulah Wallace.

WHEREAS, Beulah Wallace has worked closely with the local schools, chairing fund raisers for band equipment and working with the PTA; and

WHEREAS, for over 50 years, Beulah Wallace has been a prominent and active member of the Williamsburg-James City-York Branch of the NAACP; and

WHEREAS, in addition to her tireless efforts on behalf of worthy organizations, Beulah Wallace has helped countless people on an individual level, providing money, food, clothing and counseling to many local families in distress; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly commend Beulah Wallace for setting an enviable standard of selflessness, generosity and devotion to the welfare of her community; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution for presentation to Beulah Wallace as an expression of the General Assembly's gratitude for her long and productive career of service to her community.
