4	Virginia Retirement System.

9 10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 51.1-142 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 51.1-142. Prior service or membership credit for certain members.
13	A. Any member in service may purchase credit for service lost as a result of the following:
14	1. Rejection of membership in the retirement system.
15	2. Cessation of membership under this chapter because of the withdrawal of his accumulated
16	contributions.
17	3. Exclusion from membership because of being a member of the General Assembly or other state
18	officer elected by the people.
19	4. Termination of service as an officer or employee of a political subdivision in a position which
20	subsequently became covered by the retirement system and for which prior service credit was granted.
21	In order to receive credit for the service, the member must pay an amount equal to the contributions
22	that he would have made during the entire period to be credited, assuming that the member contribution
23	rate specified in this chapter as of the date of payment had been in effect during the entire period and
24	that the higher of the member's creditable compensation or average final compensation as of the date of
25 26	payment had been received during the entire period.
20 27	When a member requests credit for a portion of the period, the most recent portion shall be credited. Payment may be made in a lump sum or by an additional payroll deduction. Only one additional
28	deduction shall be permitted at any time. Should the additional deduction be terminated prior to
29	purchasing the entire period which might otherwise be credited, the member shall be credited with the
30	number of additional months of service for which payments are made. If the additional deduction is
31	continued beyond the point at which the entire period has been purchased, the member shall be credited
32	with no more than the entire period which might otherwise have been credited and the excess amount
33	deducted shall be refunded to the member.
34	B. Any vested member in service with at least twenty-five years of creditable service in the
35	Retirement System may purchase prior service credit for active duty military service in the armed forces
36	of the United States, provided that the discharge from the armed forces was not dishonorable and the
37	member has not withdrawn his accumulated contributions. For purposes of this subsection, "active duty
38 39	military service" means full-time service of at least 180 consecutive days in the United States Army,
40	Navy, Air Force, Marines, Coast Guard, or reserve components thereof. Such prior service credit shall be calculated at the ratio of one year of prior service credit to one
41	year of active duty military service, up to a maximum of four years of prior service credit. The member
42	must pay an amount equal to five percent of his present annual compensation for each year to be
43	credited or five percent of his average annual creditable compensation during his thirty-six highest
44	consecutive months of creditable service, whichever is greater. Such prior service credit shall not be
45	otherwise creditable as prior service under this chapter nor considered in the calculation of any
46	retirement benefit by another retirement system. Prior service credit for more than four years of service
47	in the armed forces of the United States may be purchased by the member pursuant to § 51.1-143.
48	B. C. Any member granted a leave of absence for any of the following reasons may purchase
49	limited service on the basis set forth in subsection A of this section:
50	1. Up to four years of service for any leave of absence for educational purposes or for temporary
51 52	employment with the General Assembly.
52 53	2. Up to four years of service subsequent to January 1, 1964, for any leave of absence due to illness or disability or service which was temporarily terminated due to illness or disability.
53 54	C. D. Any member in service who was denied membership because of having attained age sixty
55	when first employed or reemployed may purchase all or any portion of service lost as a result of denial
56	upon payment in a lump sum of the amount the member would have contributed had he been allowed to
57	participate in the system.
58	\mathbf{D} . E. Service may be credited at no cost under the following circumstances:
59	1. Any member who was a member of the abolished system and who was in service on March 1,

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60 1952, shall receive credit for service rendered as a state employee or teacher prior to July 1, 1942,61 provided the member has not received a refund of accumulated contributions since becoming a member

62 of the abolished system.

63 2. Any member in service who is credited with five or more years of membership service who
64 rendered full-time salaried service as a state employee or teacher prior to July 1, 1942, may receive
65 credit for same.

3. Any member who is a teacher may receive credit for service rendered as a nonprofessional
employee of a school board provided the school board has extended coverage to its nonprofessional
employees and granted credit for service rendered prior to the effective date of coverage.

4. Any vested member who is a teacher shall receive up to two years of service credit for any involuntary leave of absence, without pay, required by local school division policies related to pregnancy or childbirth provided (i) the member was on such leave from a covered position prior to July 1, 1974, (ii) the member has not withdrawn all accumulated contributions, and (iii) the member reenters service in a covered position. In such instances, the employer, or its successors, which had such policies in place and applied same to the teacher seeking additional service credit shall be liable for the cost of providing such service credit.

5. Any member may receive credit for service rendered in the armed forces of the United States provided (i) the member was on leave of absence from a covered position, (ii) the discharge from the armed forces was not dishonorable, (iii) the member has not withdrawn his accumulated contributions, and (iv) the member reenters service in a covered position within one year after discharge from the armed forces. No period of service rendered, through reenlistment, beyond the cessation of hostilities shall be creditable service.

82 E. F. Any member of the abolished system may transfer accumulated contributions in that system to
83 the Retirement System within one year after becoming a member of the Retirement System.

F. G. Any vested member in service who (i) by virtue of an order of a court of this Commonwealth
granting special police powers, enforced the laws of the Commonwealth at any time between 1964 and
1981 as a uniformed law-enforcement officer in any incorporated or unincorporated town in any county
with a population between 55,000 and 60,000, as reported in the 1990 census of the population of the
United States, and at the time of such member's law-enforcement service, such county participated in the
Virginia Retirement System; (ii) reentered service in a covered position; and (iii) has not withdrawn his
accumulated contributions, may purchase prior service credit pursuant to § 51.1-144.

91 G.H. Any vested member in service who (i) prior to January 1, 1982, was employed by the 92 Commissioner of Revenue in any city of this Commonwealth with a population greater than 200,000, as 93 reported in the 1990 census of the population of the United States, and (ii) on January 1, 1982, became an employee of the Director of Finance in any city of this Commonwealth with a population greater 94 than 200,000, as reported in the 1990 census of the population of the United States, which participated 95 in the Virginia Refirement System; and (iii) has not withdrawn his accumulated contributions, may 96 transfer his years of creditable service from the city's retirement plan to the Virginia Retirement System. 97 98 The Virginia Retirement System shall compute the present value of the retirement benefit of service so 99 transferred and the city's retirement plan shall pay in a manner prescribed by the Retirement System.

100 2. That the provisions of this act shall apply to employees of political subdivisions unless the 101 employer notifies the Board of Trustees otherwise in writing on or before July 1, 1996.
