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### VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY — CHAPTER

An Act to amend and reenact § 11-41.2:1 of the Code of Virginia, relating to Public Procurement Act;
 design-build authority.

## 6 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

7 1. That § 11-41.2:1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:

8 § 11-41.2:1. Design-build or construction management contracts for public bodies other than the
 9 Commonwealth authorized.

10 Notwithstanding any other provisions of law to the contrary: (i) the City of Richmond may enter into a contract for the construction of a visitors' center; (ii) Prince William County and the Cities of 11 12 Manassas and Manassas Park may enter into a contract for the construction of a regional jail; (iii) the 13 Counties of Fluvanna, Greene, Louisa, Madison and Orange may enter into a contract for a regional jail; (iv) the City of Norfolk may enter into a contract for construction of a jail and construction of a 14 15 replacement public health center; (v) the City of Winchester and the Counties of Clarke and Frederick may enter into a contract for the construction of an adult regional detention facility; (vi) the Counties of 16 King George and Spotsylvania, the City of Fredericksburg, and any other counties which are members 17 of the Rappahannock Regional Jail Board may enter into a contract for the construction of a regional 18 19 jail; (vii) the County of Henrico may enter into a contract for enlargement or renovation of its existing 20 jail or the Counties of Henrico, Goochland and New Kent may enter into a contract for the construction 21 of a regional jail; (viii) the Counties of King George, Richmond, and Westmoreland and the Town of Warsaw, or any combination of three or more of those localities, may enter into a contract for the 22 23 construction of a regional jail; (ix) the Counties of Alleghany and Bath and the Cities of Covington and 24 Clifton Forge, or any three, may enter into a contract for construction of a regional jail; (x) Albemarle 25 County and the City of Charlottesville may enter into a contract for the construction of an addition to 26 the Albemarle-Charlottesville Joint Security Complex; (xi) the City of Chesapeake may enter into a 27 contract for the construction of a replacement for the Jordan Bridge; (xii) the County of Northampton 28 may enter into a contract for the construction of a jail; (xiii) any political subdivision either individually 29 or in conjunction with other political subdivisions may enter into a contract for the construction of a 30 materials recovery facility or a solid waste processing facility; (xiv) any city with a 1990 United States 31 Census population in excess of 350,000 persons may enter into a contract for the construction of a 32 long-term water supply project from the Roanoke River and the expansion of a Marine Science 33 Museum; (xv) the City of Chesapeake may enter into a contract for the renovation of its existing jail 34 and the construction of a new jail; (xvi) the Town of Vienna may enter into contracts for the construction of a Public Works and Maintenance Buildings Project at the Northside Property Yard, and 35 reconstruction of the Town Hall to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act (42 U.S.C. § 12101 36 37 et seq.), and relocation of utilities and reconstruction of bus shelters, sidewalks, driveway aprons and 38 crosswalks and landscaping along the Maple Avenue Business District; (xvii) the County of Frederick 39 may enter into a contract for the construction of county administrative offices; (xviii) the Counties of 40 James City and York, and the Cities of Poquoson and Williamsburg may enter into a contract for the 41 construction of the Virginia Peninsula Regional Jail; (xix) the Counties of Essex, Mathews, Middlesex, 42 King and Queen and King William may enter into a contract for the construction of the Middle 43 Peninsula Regional Security Center; (xx) the County of Powhatan may enter into a contract for the renovation of the former public school building; (xxi) the Virginia Baseball Stadium Authority may 44 45 enter into a contract for the construction of a major league baseball stadium in Northern Virginia Planning District 8; (xxii) the school board of any county with a population of less than 100,000 and 46 adjacent to a county having the urban county executive form of government may enter into contracts for 47 the construction of two public schools; (xxiii) the school board of any city with a population between 48 49 16,100 and 18,100 may enter into a contract for the renovation and improvement of a public school; and 50 (xxiv) any county with a population in excess of 200,000 and adjacent to a county having the urban county executive form of government may enter into contracts for the construction of a biotechnology 51 laboratory, office, and warehouse facility; (xxv) the school board of the City of Richmond may enter into 52 53 contracts for the construction of three public schools and the renovation of one public school; (xxvi) the 54 City of Chesapeake may enter into contracts for the improvement of South Battlefield Boulevard; (xxvii) 55 the school board of Accomack County may enter into contracts for the construction of four public 56 schools and the renovation of two public schools; (xxviii) the school board of the County of Culpeper

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may enter into a contract for the construction of an elementary school; (xxix) the County of Loudoun or 57 58 its industrial development authority may enter into contracts for the expansion or replacement of the 59 Loudoun County Courthouse; and (xxx) the County of York may enter into contracts for the construction 60 of a courthouse, on a fixed price or not-to-exceed price design-build basis or construction management 61 basis in accordance with procedures consistent with those described in this chapter for procurement of 62 nonprofessional services through competitive negotiation. Such governing bodies may authorize payment to no more than three responsive bidders who are not awarded the design-build contract if such 63 64 governing bodies determine that such payment is necessary to promote competition. Such governing 65 bodies shall not be required to award a design-build contract to the lowest bidder, but may consider 66 price as one factor in evaluating the proposals received. Such governing bodies shall maintain adequate 67 records to allow post-project evaluation by the Commonwealth.

68 For purposes of this section, "materials recovery facility" shall mean a facility receiving source separated recyclable materials and processing them for the secondary materials market, and "solid waste processing facility" shall mean a facility which specializes in the recovery of recyclable and reusable materials from a solid waste stream and which may include the production of fuel or compost or both.

72 2. That, notwithstanding any other provision of law, the authority for the construction or
73 renovation of a particular project granted under the provisions of this act shall expire on January
74 1, 1997, unless a design-build or construction management contract is entered into by the public

75 body on or before January 1, 1997.

76 3. That an emergency exists and this act is in force from its passage.
