968124492 **SENATE BILL NO. 609** 1 2 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 3 (Proposed by the House Committee on General Laws 4 5 6 on February 28, 1996) (Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Lambert) A BILL to amend and reenact § 11-41.2:1 of the Code of Virginia, relating to Public Procurement Act; 7 design-build authority. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 8 9 1. That § 11-41.2:1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 10 § 11-41.2:1. Design-build or construction management contracts for public bodies other than the 11 Commonwealth authorized. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law to the contrary: (i) the City of Richmond may enter into 12 13 a contract for the construction of a visitors' center; (ii) Prince William County and the Cities of Manassas and Manassas Park may enter into a contract for the construction of a regional jail; (iii) the 14 15 Counties of Fluvanna, Greene, Louisa, Madison and Orange may enter into a contract for a regional jail; (iv) the City of Norfolk may enter into a contract for construction of a jail and construction of a 16 17 replacement public health center; (v) the City of Winchester and the Counties of Clarke and Frederick may enter into a contract for the construction of an adult regional detention facility; (vi) the Counties of 18 19 King George and Spotsylvania, the City of Fredericksburg, and any other counties which are members 20 of the Rappahannock Regional Jail Board may enter into a contract for the construction of a regional 21 jail; (vii) the County of Henrico may enter into a contract for enlargement or renovation of its existing jail or the Counties of Henrico, Goochland and New Kent may enter into a contract for the construction 22 23 of a regional jail; (viii) the Counties of King George, Richmond, and Westmoreland and the Town of 24 Warsaw, or any combination of three or more of those localities, may enter into a contract for the 25 construction of a regional jail; (ix) the Counties of Alleghany and Bath and the Cities of Covington and Clifton Forge, or any three, may enter into a contract for construction of a regional jail; (x) Albemarle 26 27 County and the City of Charlottesville may enter into a contract for the construction of an addition to 28 the Albemarle-Charlottesville Joint Security Complex; (xi) the City of Chesapeake may enter into a 29 contract for the construction of a replacement for the Jordan Bridge; (xii) the County of Northampton 30 may enter into a contract for the construction of a jail; (xiii) any political subdivision either individually 31 or in conjunction with other political subdivisions may enter into a contract for the construction of a 32 materials recovery facility or a solid waste processing facility; (xiv) any city with a 1990 United States Census population in excess of 350,000 persons may enter into a contract for the construction of a 33 34 long-term water supply project from the Roanoke River and the expansion of a Marine Science 35 Museum; (xv) the City of Chesapeake may enter into a contract for the renovation of its existing jail 36 and the construction of a new jail; (xvi) the Town of Vienna may enter into contracts for the 37 construction of a Public Works and Maintenance Buildings Project at the Northside Property Yard, and 38 reconstruction of the Town Hall to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act (42 U.S.C. § 12101 39 et seq.), and relocation of utilities and reconstruction of bus shelters, sidewalks, driveway aprons and crosswalks and landscaping along the Maple Avenue Business District; (xvii) the County of Frederick 40 41 may enter into a contract for the construction of county administrative offices; (xviii) the Counties of 42 James City and York, and the Cities of Poquoson and Williamsburg may enter into a contract for the 43 construction of the Virginia Peninsula Regional Jail; (xix) the Counties of Essex, Mathews, Middlesex, King and Queen and King William may enter into a contract for the construction of the Middle 44 Peninsula Regional Security Center; (xx) the County of Powhatan may enter into a contract for the 45 renovation of the former public school building; (xxi) the Virginia Baseball Stadium Authority may 46 47 enter into a contract for the construction of a major league baseball stadium in Northern Virginia Planning District 8; (xxii) the school board of any county with a population of less than 100,000 and **48** adjacent to a county having the urban county executive form of government may enter into contracts for 49 the construction of two public schools; (xxiii) the school board of any city with a population between 50 16,100 and 18,100 may enter into a contract for the renovation and improvement of a public school; and 51 (xxiv) any county with a population in excess of 200,000 and adjacent to a county having the urban 52 53 county executive form of government may enter into contracts for the construction of a biotechnology 54 laboratory, office, and warehouse facility; (xxv) the school board of the City of Richmond may enter into contracts for the construction of three public schools and the renovation of one public school; (xxvi) the 55 City of Chesapeake may enter into contracts for the improvement of South Battlefield Boulevard; (xxvii) 56 57 the school board of Accomack County may enter into contracts for the construction of four public schools and the renovation of two public schools; (xxviii) the County of Culpeper may enter into a 58 59 contract for the construction of an elementary school; and (xxix) the County of Loudoun or its industrial

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60 development authority may enter into contracts for the expansion or replacement of the Loudoun County

Courthouse, on a fixed price or not-to-exceed price design-build basis or construction management basis 61 62 in accordance with procedures consistent with those described in this chapter for procurement of 63 nonprofessional services through competitive negotiation. Such governing bodies may authorize payment 64 to no more than three responsive bidders who are not awarded the design-build contract if such 65 governing bodies determine that such payment is necessary to promote competition. Such governing 66 bodies shall not be required to award a design-build contract to the lowest bidder, but may consider price as one factor in evaluating the proposals received. Such governing bodies shall maintain adequate 67 records to allow post-project evaluation by the Commonwealth. **68** 

69 For purposes of this section, "materials recovery facility" shall mean a facility receiving source separated recyclable materials and processing them for the secondary materials market, and "solid waste processing facility" shall mean a facility which specializes in the recovery of recyclable and reusable materials from a solid waste stream and which may include the production of fuel or compost or both.

73 2. That the authority for the construction or renovation of a particular project granted under the

73 2. That the authority for the construction of renovation of a particular project granted under the 74 provisions of this act shall expire on January 1, 1997 unless a design-build or construction 75 management contract is entered into by the public body on or before January 1, 1997.
