1 2 Offered January 22, 1996 3 A BILL to amend and reenact § 22.1-79 of the Code of Virginia, relating to powers and duties of 4 5 6 7 school boards. Patrons-Lambert and Marsh; Delegates: McEachin and Rhodes 8 Referred to the Committee on Education and Health 9 10 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

11 1. That § 22.1-79 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 12

§ 22.1-79. Powers and duties.

A school board shall:

1. See that the school laws are properly explained, enforced and observed;

15 2. Secure, by visitation or otherwise, as full information as possible about the conduct of the public schools in the school division and take care that they are conducted according to law and with the 16 17 utmost efficiency:

18 3. Care for, manage and control the property of the school division and provide for the erecting, furnishing, and equipping, and operation of necessary school buildings and appurtenances and the 19 20 maintenance thereof by purchase, lease, or other contracts;

21 4. Provide for the consolidation of schools or redistricting of school boundaries or adopt pupil 22 assignment plans whenever such procedure will contribute to the efficiency of the school division;

23 5. Insofar as not inconsistent with state statutes and regulations of the Board of Education, operate 24 and maintain the public schools in the school division and determine the length of the school term, the studies to be pursued, the methods of teaching and the government to be employed in the schools; 25

26 6. In instances in which no grievance procedure has been adopted prior to January 1, 1991, establish and administer by July 1, 1992, a grievance procedure for all school board employees, except the 27 division superintendent and those employees covered under the provisions of Article 2 (§ 22.1-293 et 28 29 seq.) and Article 3 (§ 22.1-306 et seq.) of Chapter 15 of this title, who have completed such 30 probationary period as may be required by the school board, not to exceed eighteen months. The grievance procedure shall afford a timely and fair method of the resolution of disputes arising between 31 32 the school board and such employees regarding dismissal, suspension, or other disciplinary actions and 33 shall be consistent with the provisions of the Board of Education's procedures for adjusting grievances 34 except that there shall be no right to a hearing before a fact-finding panel; 35

7. Perform such other duties as shall be prescribed by the Board of Education or as are imposed by 36 law; and

37 8. Obtain public comment through a public hearing not less than ten days after reasonable notice to 38 the public in a newspaper of general circulation in the school division prior to providing (i) for the consolidation of schools or (ii) in school divisions having 15,000 pupils or more in average daily 39 membership, for redistricting of school boundaries or adopting any pupil assignment plan affecting the 40 41 assignment of fifteen percent or more of the pupils in average daily membership in the affected school. 42 Such public hearing may be held at the same time and place as the meeting of the school board at which the proposed action is taken if the public hearing is held before the action is taken. If a public 43 hearing has been held prior to the effective date of this provision on a proposed consolidation, 44 redistricting or pupil assignment plan which is to be implemented after the effective date of this 45 provision, an additional public hearing shall not be required. 46
