963238745 1 **SENATE BILL NO. 78** Offered January 10, 1996 2 3 4 5 6 7 A BILL for the relief of Walter Tyrone Snyder, Jr. Patrons-Ticer; Delegates: Moran and Van Landingham Referred to the Committee on Finance 8 9 Whereas, in January 1986, Walter Tyrone Snyder, Jr., was arrested by the City of Alexandria police for the rape and sexual assault of a resident of the City; and 10 Whereas, in June 1986, Walter Tyrone Snyder, Jr., was convicted by a jury of the City of Alexandria 11 12 on five counts of rape and sexual assault; and Whereas, in October 1986, Walter Tyrone Snyder, Jr., was sentenced by the Circuit court of the City 13 14 of Alexandria to serve 45 years in prison; and Whereas, in 1992, privately conducted DNA testing of evidence gathered in the investigation of said 15 16 crimes demonstrated that Walter Tyrone Snyder, Jr., did not commit the crimes; and 17 Whereas, the Commonwealth's Attorney for the City of Alexandria subsequently confirmed the 18 results of the DNA testing of said evidence, and became convinced beyond a reasonable doubt that Walter Tyrone Snyder, Jr., had been unjustly imprisoned; and 19 20 Whereas, on April 23, 1993, in response to a petition filed by Walter Tyrone Snyder, Jr., and 21 supported by the Commonwealth's Attorney for the City of Alexandria, Governor L. Douglas Wilder granted Walter Tyrone Snyder, Jr., an absolute pardon for his 1986 conviction on the five counts of rape 22 23 and sexual assault: and Whereas, on April 23, 1993, Walter Tyrone Snyder, Jr., was released from prison after having been 24 25 incarcerated for almost seven years for crimes that DNA testing demonstrated he did not commit; and 26 Whereas, the City of Alexandria has already provided compensation to Walter Tyrone Snyder, Jr., in 27 recognition of the substantial time that he was incarcerated for crimes that DNA testing demonstrated he 28 did not commit; and 29 Whereas, Walter Tyrone Snyder, Jr., has suffered severe physical, emotional, and psychological 30 damage as a result of this wrongful restraint of his personal liberty and has no other means to obtain the 31 adequate relief now requested except by action of this body; now, therefore, 32 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. § 1. That there is hereby appropriated from the general fund of the state treasury the sum of \$230,000 for the relief of Walter Tyrone Snyder, Jr. This sum shall be paid as herein provided upon 33 34 35 execution by Walter Tyrone Snyder, Jr., of a release of all claims he may have against the 36 Commonwealth or any agency, instrumentality, officer, employee, or political subdivision thereof, in 37 connection with the aforesaid occurrence. The award granted hereby is subject to the further following 38 conditions: \$200,000 of the appropriation shall be paid to Walter Tyrone Snyder, Jr., by check issued by 39 the State Treasurer on a warrant issued by the Comptroller, and the State Treasurer shall place \$30,000 40 of the appropriation in a special fund established in the state treasury. Interest earned from moneys in 41 the special fund shall accrue to the benefit of such fund. Moneys in the special fund shall be used solely 42 to pay the tuition and fees actually incurred by Walter Tyrone Snyder, Jr., at a public institution of higher education within the Commonwealth to which he gains admission. Disbursement of money from 43 the special fund shall be made directly to the public institution of higher education where Walter Tyrone 44 Snyder, Jr., is enrolled at the written request of the president of the institution. The written request shall 45 state the amount of tuition and fees actually incurred by Walter Tyrone Snyder, Jr.; however, any sums 46 47 remaining in the special fund on the date ten years following the effective date of this act shall be **48** deposited in the general fund.
