4	A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered 22.1-97.1, relating to appeal of computation of the composite index of local ability-to-pay.

9 10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 22.1-97.1 as follows:
12	§ 22.1-97.1. Appeal of computation of the composite index of local ability-to-pay.
13	The Board of Education shall establish, pursuant to the Administrative Process Act (§ 9-6.14:1 et
14	seq.), a procedure for appeal of the computation of the composite index of local ability-to-pay or "local
15	composite index" (LCI) as formulated in the appropriation act. The President of the Board shall appoint
16	a review committee consisting of three members of the Board; the Superintendent of Public Instruction,
17	who shall serve as secretary to the committee; and a local school board member. The Secretary of
18	Education or his designee and the Secretary of Finance or his designee shall also serve on the
19 20	LCI-review committee.
20 21	Any school board may petition the Board for a review of its determination of the cost apportioned to it for maintaining an educational program meeting the Standards of Quality (§ 22.1-253.13:1 et seq.).
$\frac{21}{22}$	No local school board may petition the Board for a review of its LCI computation more than once in
23	any two consecutive calendar years. In response to such petition, the Superintendent of Public
24	Instruction shall prepare a detailed analysis of such school board's LCI and related computations. The
25	Board shall review this analysis, and, upon a finding of extenuating circumstances which, when factored
26	into the formula for calculating the LCI, may significantly affect the computation of the costs
27	apportioned to the locality, the Board shall grant the appeal and so notify the Superintendent of Public
28	Instruction to convene the committee to hear the appeal. The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall
29	poll the committee; establish a time, date, and place for the hearing; and so notify the petitioning
30 31	school board.
31 32	Within sixty days of any such hearing, the committee shall provide the petitioning school board, the Governor, the House Committee on Appropriations, and the Senate Committee on Finance with its
32 33	findings.
33 34	Consistent with applicable law, the Department of Education may incorporate any committee findings
35	which require adjustments to the calculations of the petitioning school board's apportioned costs of the
36	Standards of Quality as derived through the LCI.
