963268749 **SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 35** 1 2 Offered January 18, 1996 3 Requesting the Secretary of Transportation to establish a Western Transportation Corridor Study Policy 4 Advisory Committee. 5 6 7 Patrons—Waddell, Colgan, Couric, Houck, Howell, Saslaw, Ticer and Whipple; Delegates: Mims and Watts 8 9 Referred to the Committee on Rules 10 11 WHEREAS, the planning, design, right-of-way acquisition, and ultimate construction of a highway to serve as a connector between Interstate Routes 95, 81, and 70 in Northern Virginia is critical to the 12 encouragement and management of future economic growth in the Washington, D.C., metropolitan 13 14 region; and 15 WHEREAS, construction of such a highway is critical in providing southern and western access to 16 Washington Dulles International Airport and improved southern access to the Virginia Inland Port at 17 Front Royal, Virginia; and 18 WHEREAS, a major investment study (MIS) for the Northern Virginia Western Transportation 19 Corridor currently is being conducted by the Virginia Department of Transportation; and 20 WHEREAS, public hearings connected with this study concluded in December 1995, and 21 WHEREAS, the MIS is expected to be completed by mid-1996, with recommendations and decisions based on that study to be reviewed and approved by the Northern Virginia Transportation Coordinating 22 23 Council, Metropolitan Planning Organizations, the Commonwealth Transportation Board, and other 24 regional transportation commissions; and 25 WHEREAS, there is a need for early participation by appropriate elected and appointed local, regional, and state public officials in the MIS efforts so as to (i) facilitate the process of developments 26 27 of these recommendations and decisions arising from the MIS and (ii) encourage future cooperation and 28 coordination of planning, preliminary engineering, design, right-of-way acquisition, funding, and 29 construction of any such highway; and 30 WHEREAS, the Secretary of Transportation and the Virginia Department of Transportation and Rail 31 and Public Transportation have established Policy Advisory Committees for other studies such as the Woodrow Wilson Bridge, Dulles Corridor Rail and I-66 Corridor; now, therefore, be it 32 RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Secretary of Transportation be hereby requested to establish a Western Transportation Corridor Study Policy Advisory Committee to 33 34 35 assist the Virginia Department of Transportation in completing the aforementioned MIS on a timely and 36 coordinated basis; and, be it RESOLVED FURTHER, That such Advisory Committee shall consist of the following twenty-two 37 38 members: the Secretary of Transportation or his designee, who shall serve as Chairman; the Commissioner of the Virginia Department of Transportation or his designee, who shall serve as 39 Vice-Chairman; the Director of the Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation or his 40 designee; the District Administrator of the Virginia Department of Transportation's Northern Virginia 41 Construction District; the Chairman of the Northern Virginia Transportation Coordinating Council; the 42 Chairman of the Northern Virginia Transportation Commission; the Chairman of the 43 44 Potomac-Rappahannock Transportation District Commission; the Chairmen and one member of the Boards of Supervisors of the Counties of Fairfax, Fauquier, Loudoun, Prince William and Stafford; the 45 Chairman of the Virginia Senate Transportation Committee; the Chairman of the Virginia Senate Finance 46 Committee's Transportation Subcommittee; and a senior Northern Virginia member from the House of 47 Delegates Committees on Appropriations, Finance, and Roads and Internal Navigation. **48** 

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
