8 9	WHEREAS, Senate Joint Resolution 383 (1995) established a joint subcommittee to examine the
10 11	delivery of certain government services in the Greater Richmond area; and WHEREAS, the joint subcommittee met five times during 1995 to determine which, if any,
12 13	government services should be considered for regionalization; and WHEREAS, the joint subcommittee decided that a cost/benefit analysis performed by an outside
14 15	consultant would be helpful to the study; and WHEREAS, the joint subcommittee decided to participate in the "request for proposals" (RFP)
16 17	process in order to contract with a consultant to perform such an analysis; and WHEREAS, the RFP process was extremely time-consuming; and
18	WHEREAS, the joint subcommittee was allotted \$10,000 for consulting services; and
19	WHEREAS, the complete cost/benefit analysis will require more funding as well as time to
20	complete; and
21 22	WHEREAS, the goals of the joint subcommittee cannot be achieved without such an analysis; now, therefore, be it
$\frac{22}{23}$	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Greater Richmond Area
24	Regionalism Study Joint Subcommittee be continued in order to decide on and contract with a
25	consultant to perform the cost/benefit analysis so that the joint subcommittee can complete its goal of
26 27	determining which, if any, government services should be offered on a regional basis in the Greater Richmond Area.
27 28	The direct costs of this study shall not exceed \$160,000, of which \$140,000 may be used to obtain
29	consulting services [if such funding and the manner in which those funds will be used are provided in
30	the Appropriations Act].
31	The Division of Legislative Services shall provide staff support for the study. Technical assistance
32 33	shall be provided by the Commission on Local Government. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Commission, upon request.
33 34	The joint subcommittee shall be continued for one year only and shall complete its work in time to
35	submit its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the 1997 Session of the General
36	Assembly as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for
37	processing legislative documents.
38 39	Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint Rules Committee. The Committee may withhold expenditures or delay the period for the conduct of the
40	study.
