10	WHEREAS, the Commonwealth has acknowledged that family violence is a serious problem that
11 12	merits legislative attention, but legislation alone can not adequately address the complex issues involved in family violence; and
12	WHEREAS, to effectively implement legislation and reduce the incidence of family violence the
14	Commonwealth must enlist the resources and expertise of a broad base of professionals who must
15	receive adequate and comprehensive cross-disciplinary training; and WHEREAS, the Commission on Family Violence Prevention has developed interdisciplinary training
16 17	materials designed to improve professional responses to family violence; now therefore, be it
18	RESOLVED, by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Commission on Family
19	Violence Prevention assure that training is provided for justice system professionals, including judges,
20 21	Commonwealth's attorneys, law enforcement officers, clerks, intake officers, and magistrates, on the statutory provisions and procedures related to protective orders and stalking, using materials developed
²¹ 22	by the Commission.

The Commission shall report on the results of its training effort and make further recommendations, if any, to the Governor and the 1997 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of

25 the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for processing legislative documents.
