3	A BILL to amend and reenact § 14.1-47.2 of the Code of Virginia, relating to city council salaries.

8 9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. That § 14.1-47.2 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
11	§ 14.1-47.2. Permitted salaries; salary increases; reimbursement for expenses.
12	Subject to the exception provided for in § 14.1-47.1, the annual salary of each member of the council
13	of any city shall be set by its members by ordinance notwithstanding any contrary provision of law,
14	general or special. The setting of such salaries by members of council shall include the salary of the
15	mayor or president of the council whether such official is a member of council or not.
16	Cities within the following population brackets shall be allowed to set salaries for mayors, which
17	include presidents of council, and council members not to exceed the following:

40	No increase in the salary of a member of council shall take effect during the incumbent member of
41	council's term of office; however, this restriction shall not apply to councils when the council members
42	are elected for staggered terms until July 1 after the next regularly scheduled general election of council
43 44	<i>members.</i> Every proposed increase in the salary of a member of council shall be adopted at least four months
44 45	Every proposed increase in the salary of a member of council shall be adopted at least four months prior to the date of the next municipal election except in the case of a newly created consolidated city
<b>46</b>	when the proposed increase shall be adopted at least two months prior to the date of its first municipal
47	election.
<b>48</b>	Any member of council shall be eligible to be reimbursed for any personal expenses incurred by him
<b>49</b>	for official business. However, all claims for reimbursement shall be for reasonable expenses to the
50	extent permitted by law incurred in the conduct of official city business and shall be itemized and
51	documented by stamped paid receipts to the extent feasible.

In addition to salary, each member of the council of any city may be compensated with such benefits
as are provided city employees by the city.
