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HOUSE BILL NO. 2127

Offered January 15, 1997

A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 32.1-111.4 and 32.1-111.5 of the Code of Virginia, relating to certification and recertification of emergency medical services personnel.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That §§ 32.1-111.4 and 32.1-111.5 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as 11 12 follows:

§ 32.1-111.4. Regulations; emergency medical services personnel and vehicles.

A. The State Board of Health shall prescribe by regulation:

1. Requirements for record keeping, supplies, operating procedures and other agency operations;

2. Requirements for the sanitation and maintenance of emergency medical services vehicles and their 16 17 medical supplies and equipment;

3. Procedures, including the requirements for forms, to authorize qualified emergency medical 18 services personnel to follow Emergency Medical Services Do Not Resuscitate Orders pursuant to 19 20 § 54.1-2987.1;

21 4. Requirements for the composition, administration, duties and responsibilities of the State 22 Emergency Medical Services Advisory Board:

23 5. Requirements, developed in consultation with the Emergency Medical Services Advisory Board, 24 governing the *certification* and recertification of emergency medical services personnel which shall 25 include (i) authorization, in lieu of a written examination, for continuing education, skills testing, and exemptions from the written examination for the recertification by the relevant operational medical 26 director; (ii) approval by the Office of Emergency Medical Services of continuing education modules in 27 which each module shall be tested separately; (iii) authorization of the relevant operational medical 28 29 director to require the written examinations provided by the Office of Emergency Medical Services, as 30 deemed necessary, of certain emergency medical services personnel; (iv) triennial recertification of advanced life support providers; and (v) effective on January 1, 1998, a sequential option for the 31 32 completion of the skills tests for recertification; and

33 6. Requirements for written notification to the State Emergency Medical Services Advisory Board, 34 the State Office of Emergency Medical Services, and the Financial Assistance and Review Committee of 35 the Board's action, and the reasons therefor, on requests and recommendations of the Advisory Board, 36 the State Office of Emergency Medical Services or the Committee, no later than five workdays after 37 reaching its decision, specifying whether the Board has approved, denied, or not acted on such requests 38 and recommendations.

39 B. The Board shall classify agencies and emergency medical services vehicles by type of service 40 rendered and shall specify the medical equipment, the supplies, the vehicle specifications and the 41 personnel required for each classification.

C. In formulating its regulations, the Board shall consider the current Minimal Equipment List for 42 Ambulances adopted by the Committee on Trauma of the American College of Surgeons. 43 44

§ 32.1-111.5. Certification and recertification of emergency medical services personnel.

A. The Board shall prescribe by regulation the qualifications required for certification of emergency 45 medical care attendants, including those qualifications necessary for authorization to follow Emergency 46 Medical Services Do Not Resuscitate Orders pursuant to § 54.1-2987.1. 47

B. Each person desiring certification as emergency medical services personnel shall apply to the **48** Commissioner upon a form prescribed by the Board. Upon receipt of such application, the 49 50 Commissioner shall cause the applicant to be examined or otherwise determined to be qualified for 51 certification. If the Commissioner determines that the applicant meets the requirements of such regulations, he shall issue a certificate to the applicant. An emergency medical services personnel 52 certificate so issued shall be valid for a period required by law or prescribed by the Board. The 53 54 certificates may be renewed after successful reexamination of the holder. Any certificate so issued may be suspended at any time that the Commissioner determines that the holder no longer meets the 55 qualifications prescribed for such emergency medical services personnel. 56

C. The Board shall prescribe by regulation procedures and the qualifications required for the 57 recertification of emergency medical services personnel. Such regulations shall include (i) authorization 58 59 for continuing education and skills testing, in lieu of a written examination, with the signature of the HB2127

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relevant operational medical director; (ii) authorization for the relevant operational medical director to 60

require the written examinations administered or approved by the Office of Emergency Medical Services, 61 62 as deemed necessary, of certain emergency medical services personnel; (iii) authorization for exemptions

from the written test for recertification by the relevant operational medical director; (iv) triennial 63

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- recertification of advanced life support providers; (v) approval by the Office of Emergency Medical Services of continuing education modules in which each module may be tested separately; and (vi) 65
- 66 effective on January 1, 1998, a sequential option for the completion of the skills tests for recertification. 67 C. D. The Commissioner may issue a temporary certificate when he finds that it is in the public

interest. A temporary certificate shall be valid for a period not exceeding ninety days. 68
