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## **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 248**

Offered January 22, 1996

Proposing an amendment to Section 8 of Article VIII of the Constitution of Virginia, relating to the Literary Fund.

10 RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, a majority of the members elected to each house agreeing, That the following amendment to the Constitution of Virginia be, and the same 11 hereby is, proposed and referred to the General Assembly at its first regular session held after the next 12 general election of members of the House of Delegates for its concurrence in conformity with the 13 14 provisions of Section 1 of Article XII of the Constitution of Virginia, namely:

Amend Section 8 of Article VIII of the Constitution of Virginia as follows: 15

16 Section 8. The Literary Fund.

The General Assembly shall set apart as a permanent and perpetual school fund the present Literary 17 Fund; the proceeds of all public lands donated by Congress for free public school purposes, of all 18 escheated property, of all waste and unappropriated lands, of all property accruing to the Commonwealth 19 20 by forfeiture except as hereinafter provided, of all fines collected for offenses committed against the Commonwealth, and of the annual interest on the Literary Fund; and such other sums as the General 21 Assembly may appropriate. But so long as the principal of the Fund totals as much as eighty million 22 23 dollars, the General Assembly may set aside all or any part of additional moneys received into its 24 principal for public school purposes, including the teachers retirement fund. The Fund shall be used 25 exclusively to support public school construction and renovation and other public school capital projects 26 as determined and defined by the General Assembly in general law.

The General Assembly may provide by general law an exemption from this section for the proceeds 27 28 from the sale of all property seized and forfeited to the Commonwealth for a violation of the criminal laws of this Commonwealth proscribing the manufacture, sale or distribution of a controlled substance or 29 30 marijuana. Such proceeds shall be paid into the state treasury and shall be distributed by law for the 31 purpose of promoting law enforcement.

32 The Literary Fund shall be held and administered by the Board of Education in such manner as may 33 be provided by law. The General Assembly may authorize the Board to borrow other funds against 34 assets of the Literary Fund as collateral, such borrowing not to involve the full faith and credit of the 35 Commonwealth. The General Assembly may also, in general law, authorize the Virginia Public School 36 Authority to borrow for public school capital projects and to pledge such assets of the Literary Fund to 37 such obligations as may be determined in such law.

The principal of the Fund shall include assets of the Fund in other funds or authorities which are 38 39 repayable to the Fund.

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
