11	WHEREAS, the Code of Virginia establishes that sheriffs of the independent cities of the
12	Commonwealth have the authority to create deputy sheriffs to assist them with their work; and
13	WHEREAS, city sheriffs sometimes are called upon to make arrests within the cities; and
14	WHEREAS, the Code of Virginia does not clearly delineate what powers city deputies have
15	regarding arrest; and
16	WHEREAS, because of the increasing demands placed upon city sheriffs, an evaluation of the
17	current training in relation to other law enforcement officers is necessary; now, therefore, be it
18	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Virginia State Crime
19	Commission study the necessity of additional training for city sheriffs and their deputies and the
20	necessity of clarifying the powers of arrest of the city sheriffs and deputies, including the various
21	definitions the Code of Virginia lists for "law enforcement officer."
22	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Commission, upon request.
23	The Commission shall complete its work in time to submit its findings and recommendations to the
24	Governor and the 1998 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the Division

25 of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents.
