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11	WHEREAS, charitable and nonprofit organizations, including public and private educational
12	organizations, religious societies, cultural groups, and artistic organizations, provide a variety of
13	beneficial services to the citizens of the Commonwealth; and
14	WHEREAS, support from volunteers and benefactors enables charitable and nonprofit organizations
15	to enhance the quality of these services to the community; and
16	WHEREAS, the Commonwealth desires to stimulate support for and participation by its citizens in
17	volunteer efforts to assist nonprofit organizations and charities; now, therefore, be it
18	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Secretary of Health and
19	Human Resources, with the assistance of the Secretary of Finance, be requested to conduct a study to
20	determine how the Commonwealth can encourage, facilitate, and promote citizen involvement in and
21	assistance to charitable and nonprofit organizations. In conducting the study, the Secretary shall consider:
22	1. The feasibility of increasing tax deductions or credits against Virginia's state income tax for gifts
23	to charities and nonprofit organizations, including the advisability of a tax credit on a dollar-for-dollar
24	basis of any donation above \$1,000 with a \$500 maximum credit limit for individual taxpayers and tax
25	incentives for corporate and business entities;
26	2. Ways of promoting and facilitating "time dollars" to recognize individuals who contribute services
27	to charitable and nonprofit organizations;
28	3. Methods by which the role of community organizations may be enhanced in the delivery of
29	services and meeting the needs of Virginia citizens; and
30	4. Any other matter that may encourage activities by charitable and nonprofit organizations.
31	The Secretary of Health and Human Resources shall complete his work in time to submit his

findings and recommendations to the Governor and the 1998 Regular Session of the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of 32 33 34 legislative documents.
