WHEREAS, Wesley W. Naff, Jr., a former Franklin County educator and community leader, died on August 2, 1996; and

WHEREAS, a native of Franklin County, Wesley Naff earned his bachelor's degree from Virginia Tech in 1954, then served as a medic in the U.S. Army for two years; and

WHEREAS, on his return to Franklin County, Wesley Naff began his career with the Franklin County schools as a teacher, a career that would ultimately span 30 years; and

WHEREAS, after earning his master's degree from Radford College in 1964, Wesley Naff served as assistant principal and principal at Franklin County High School, as an administrator in the school system's central office, and as associate superintendent until his retirement in 1991; and

WHEREAS, always active in his community, Wesley Naff was a member and past president of the Franklin County Chamber of Commerce, the Rocky Mount Rotary Club, and the Callaway Ruritan Club; and

WHEREAS, Wesley Naff was a member of the board of trustees of the Carillon Franklin Memorial Hospital and the board of directors of the Franklin County Family YMCA, pursuing a dream of providing every child in Franklin County the opportunity to learn to swim; and

WHEREAS, throughout his career as an educator and a civic leader, Wesley Naff demonstrated his affection for and his abiding faith in the people of his community; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly mourn the passing of a dedicated and effective public servant, Wesley W. Naff, Jr.; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution for presentation to the family of Wesley W. Naff, Jr., as an expression of the General Assembly's great respect for his memory.
