19 WHEREAS, the unit, Detachment 1, 1st Battalion, 246th Field Artillery (Fire Support Element),20 stationed in Danville, was selected because of its readiness posture; and

WHEREAS, on Friday, January 24, 1997, the unit will report to Fort Pickett to continue training for
 the planned deployment to Bosnia, where the detachment will assume the role of coordinating and
 planning artillery support for maneuver forces involved in the peace operations; and

WHEREAS, the Virginia Guardsmen will relieve Guardsmen from Pennsylvania and Massachusetts,who have been in Bosnia for the past 18 months as part of the peacekeeping forces; and

WHEREAS, the Virginia detachment's deployment to Bosnia is in support of Operation Joint Guard,the National Guard's operation in Bosnia; and

28 WHEREAS, if they are sent to Bosnia, the members of the Virginia Guard detachment will be placed
29 at the center of a delicate and potentially dangerous situation, controlled by a multinational peacekeeping
