On the death of Junius A. Haskins, Jr.

WHEREAS, Junius A. Haskins, Jr., a civil rights activist, visionary community leader, and member of the Lynchburg City Council, died on January 17, 1997; and

9 WHEREAS, a native of Lynchburg and a graduate of Dunbar High School, Junius Haskins was a
10 lifelong resident, with the exception of four years of study at Hampton Institute, of Lynchburg's Ward
11 II, which he represented on the City Council; and

WHEREAS, for nearly 30 years, Junius Haskins was employed by the Lynchburg Community ActionGroup, where he was serving as assistant director at the time of his death; and

WHEREAS, Junius Haskins served for 12 years as president of the Lynchburg Chapter of the
NAACP, was a member of the Lynchburg Civil Rights Memorial Committee, served as chairman of the
board for the Lynchburg Covenant Fellowship, and was chairman of the Virginia Municipal League's
Committee on Human Development and Education Policy; and

18 WHEREAS, Junius Haskins served for seven years on the Lynchburg School Board, then was elected19 to the Lynchburg City Council in 1992; and

20 WHEREAS, Junius Haskins' manifold contributions were recognized by the Hunton YMCA, which
21 gave him its Community Service Award in 1991, and by the Lynchburg NAACP, which gave him a
22 Meritorious Achievement Award in 1992; and

WHEREAS, known for his strongly held views, moderated by a sense of humor frequently directed
 at himself, Junius Haskins was a passionate advocate for housing reforms in all areas of the city and for
 the renovation and preservation of downtown Lynchburg; and

26 WHEREAS, Junius Haskins died while working for the city he loved, visiting the Virginia
27 Congressional delegation to garner support for federal funding for rebuilding the Kemper Street Amtrak
28 station; and
29 WHEREAS, Junius Haskins leaves an enduring legacy of visionary and effective public service, to
