CHAPTER 16.2.

A. L. PHILPOTT MANUFACTURING CENTER EXTENSION PARTNERSHIP.

§ 23-231.8. A. L. Philpott Manufacturing Extension Partnership created; mission and duties.

124 A. The A. L. Philpott Manufacturing Center, established from such funds as may be appropriated or provided, there is hereby established pursuant to Chapters 217 and 668 of the 1992 Acts of Assembly, 125 126 as amended, is hereby continued and redesignated the A. L. Philpott Manufacturing Center Extension 127 Partnership, referred to in this chapter as the Center, whose Extension Partnership. The mission of the 128 Extension Partnership is to help create and maintain industrial and manufacturing jobs. The Center 129 *Extension Partnership* shall:

130 1. Develop, demonstrate, test, and assist in the implementation of advanced manufacturing 131 technologies.

132 2. Promote industrial expansion by providing manufacturing technology consulting services to 133 manufacturers in Virginia.

134 3. Foster the creation of manufacturing networks and the development of buyer and supplier 135 relationships in the region and throughout the Commonwealth.

136 4. Serve as a resource center for industrial training and technology transfer programs for the renewal, 137 enhancement, and expansion of existing manufacturing enterprises and for manufacturing modernization 138 outreach.

139 5. Be available as a federal demonstration center for the training of displaced workers in a **140** manufacturing area.

141 6. Receive and accept any available grants, from any federal, state, or private agency, corporation, 142 association or person, to be expended in accomplishing the goals enumerated in subdivisions 1 through 5 143 above.

144 B. The Center Extension Partnership shall be considered a local or regional industrial or economic 145 development authority or organization for purposes of the Virginia Freedom of Information Act 146 (§ 2.1-340 et seq.). 147

§ 23-231.9. Membership of governing board; terms; compensation; officers; bylaws.

148 A. The <u>Center</u> Extension Partnership shall be governed by a seventeen twenty-three-member board of 149 trustees consisting of three presidents of community colleges; two presidents of public four-year 150 institutions of higher education, and one president of a private four-year institution of higher education; 151 nine *fifteen* citizen members, representing manufacturing industries, to be appointed by the Governor; the 152 director or his designee of the Center for Innovative Technology; and the Secretary of Commerce and 153 Trade.

154 B. Initial appointments in 1992 shall be as follows: the three community college presidents shall be 155 appointed for two-year, three-year, and four-year terms, respectively; the two presidents of the public 156 four-year institutions shall be appointed for two-year and four-year terms, respectively; the president of a 157 private four-year institution shall be appointed for a three-year term; two citizen members shall be 158 appointed for two-year terms, and two citizen members shall be appointed for three-year and four-year 159 terms, respectively. Of the five citizen members to be appointed in 1994, two shall be appointed for 160 two-year terms, two shall be appointed for three-year terms, and one shall be appointed for a four-year term. Of the six citizen members to be appointed in 1997, two shall be appointed for two-year terms, 161 162 two shall be appointed for three-year terms, and two shall be appointed for four-year terms. Thereafter, all appointments shall be for terms of four years, except that appointments to fill vacancies shall be for 163 164 the unexpired terms. With the exceptions of the director or his designee of the Center for Innovative Technology and the Secretary of Commerce and Trade, no person shall be eligible to serve for more 165 than two successive four-year terms; however, upon the expiration of a term of less than four years, or 166 167 after the expiration of the remainder of a term to which appointed to fill a vacancy, two additional terms 168 may be served by such member if appointed thereto.

169 C. The board shall elect a chairman and a vice chairman from among its members and shall also 170 elect a secretary and a treasurer, who may or may not be members of the board. The board may also 171 elect other subordinate officers, who may or may not be members of the board. All members shall be 172 reimbursed for their actual expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in the work of the 173 **Center** Extension Partnership.

174 D. The board may adopt, alter, or repeal its own bylaws that govern the manner in which its 175 business may be transacted and may form committees and advisory councils, which may include 176 representatives who are not board members.

177 § 23-231.10. Executive director; powers and duties; staff.

178 A. The board shall appoint an executive director for the Center who shall (i) supervise and manage 4 of 4

the Center Extension Partnership, (ii) discharge such functions as may be directed by the board, and
shall (iii) prepare and submit, upon direction and approval by the board, all requests for appropriations.
The executive director shall be authorized to employ such staff as necessary to enable the Center *Extension Partnership* to perform its duties as set forth in this chapter. The board is authorized to
determine staff duties and to fix salaries and compensation from such funds as may be appropriated or
received. In addition, the board is authorized to make arrangements with institutions of higher education
to extend course credit to graduate students employed by the Center Extension Partnership.

B. Additional staff support for the functions of the <u>Center Extension Partnership</u> may be provided by
the Center for Innovative Technology, the University of Virginia Center for Public Service, community
colleges and four-year institutions of higher education, small business development centers, and private
businesses.

190 § 23-231.11. Additional powers and duties.

191 To assist the Extension Partnership in its mission, the board is authorized on behalf of the Center **192** Extension Partnership to:

193 1. Apply for, accept, and expend gifts, grants, or donations from public or private sources to enable
 194 it *the Extension Partnership* to carry out its objectives;

195 2. Fix, alter, charge, and collect rates, fees, and other charges for the sale of products of, or
196 services rendered by the Extension Partnership at rates to be determined by it to pay the expenses of the
197 Extension Partnership;

198 3. Make and enter into all contracts or agreements which are necessary or incidental to the
199 performance of its duties and to the execution of powers granted by this chapter, including agreements
200 with any federal agency, person, private firm, or other organization that can provide technical or other
201 business assistance to the Extension Partnership's industrial clients;

4. Employ, at its discretion, consultants, researchers, architects, engineers, accountants, financial
experts, investment bankers, superintendents, managers, and such other employees and agents as may be
necessary, and to fix their compensation to be payable from funds made available to the Extension
Partnership;

206 5. Render advice and assistance and provide services to state and federal agencies, local and
207 regional economic development entities, private firms, and other persons or organizations providing
208 services or facilities for small and medium-sized manufacturers and industrial firms in Virginia;

209 6. Develop and provide programs or projects, at its discretion, alone or in cooperation with any
210 person; state or federal agency; state, local, or regional economic development entity; private firm; or
211 other organization for economic development through improvements in industrial competitiveness in
212 Virginia; and

213 7. Do all acts and things necessary or convenient to carry out the powers granted to it by this chapter or any other acts.

215 § 23-231.12. Cooperation of other agencies; legal services.

All agencies of the Commonwealth shall cooperate with the Center Extension Partnership and, upon request, assist the Center Extension Partnership in the performance of its duties and responsibilities. The Attorney General shall provide legal services for the Extension Partnership pursuant to Chapter 11

219 (§ 2.1-117 et seq.) of Title 2.1.
