305 § 23-91.23:1. Institute of Government continued.

306 The Virginia Institute of Government at the University of Virginia is hereby continued and shall be referred to in this article as "the Institute".

308 § 23-91.23:2. Functions, powers and duties of Institute.

A. The Institute shall (i) develop a comprehensive training curriculum for local government officials
and negotiate and enter into contracts for the delivery of such training through state and local agencies,
institutions of higher education, professional organizations, and other entities; and (ii) develop a
technical library and make available to state and local officials data bases and information resources
regarding various aspects of local government operations.

314 § 23-91.23:3. Advisory board.

315 The advisory board for the Institute established pursuant to Chapter 966 of the 1994 Acts of 316 Assembly is hereby continued, and shall be known as the Advisory Board for the Institute of Government. The Board shall consist of eighteen members as follows: two members of the Senate, to be 317 318 appointed by the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections; four members of the House of Delegates, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House; two Cabinet officials; four representatives of 319 320 higher education, to be appointed by the Governor; and six representatives of local governments comprised of: two municipal officials, one each to be appointed by the Virginia Municipal League and 321 322 the Virginia Local Government Management Association; two county officials, one each to be appointed 323 by the Virginia Association of Counties and the Virginia Local Government Management Association; 324 and two officials, one each to be appointed by the Virginia Association of Locally-Elected Constitutional 325 Officers and the Virginia Local Government Attorneys' Association.

Of the appointments to the advisory board made on and after July 1, 1996, one-half of the House
and Senate members shall be appointed for two-year terms, and one-half shall be appointed for
three-year terms; one Cabinet official shall be appointed for a two-year term and one shall be
appointed for a three-year term; two representatives of higher education shall be appointed for two-year
terms and two shall be appointed for three-year terms; and the local government officials appointed by
the Virginia Municipal League, the Virginia Association of Counties, and the Virginia Association of
Locally-Elected Constitutional Officers shall be appointed for three-year terms.

334 Thereafter, all appointments shall be for terms of two years each, except appointments to fill unexpired vacancies which shall be made for the remainder of the unexpired terms. No person shall be 335 336 eligible to serve more than two consecutive two-year terms, except that a member may be appointed to 337 a term of less than two years immediately prior to or between the two-year terms, and any member 338 whose initial appointment was for a three-year term shall be eligible for reappointment for a two-year 339 term. The terms of members serving by virtue of their state or local office shall expire upon termination 340 of such state or local office. All members shall continue to hold office until their successors have been 341 appointed and have qualified.

342 2. That members currently serving on the Advisory Board shall be eligible for reappointment to 343 the Board pursuant to this act.
