977820758 **SENATE BILL NO. 974** 1 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 234567 (Proposed by the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Natural Resources on February 3, 1997) (Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Whipple) A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered 10.1-1186.1, relating to environmental mediation. 8 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 9 1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 10.1-1186.1 as follows: 10 § 10.1-1186.1. Additional powers of Boards; mediation; alternative dispute resolution. 11 A. The State Air Pollution Control Board, the State Water Control Board and the Virginia Waste Management Board, in their discretion, may employ mediation as defined in § 8.01-581.21, or a dispute 12 resolution proceeding as defined in § 8.01-576.4, in appropriate cases to resolve underlying issues, 13 reach consensus or compromise on contested issues. An "appropriate case" means any process related 14 15 to the development of a regulation or the issuance of a permit in which it is apparent that there are 16 significant issues of disagreement among interested persons. The Boards shall consider not using a 17 mediation or dispute resolution proceeding if: 18 1. A definitive or authoritative resolution of the matter is required for precedential value, and such a 19 proceeding is not likely to be accepted generally as an authoritative precedent; 20 2. The matter involves or may bear upon significant questions of state policy that require additional 21 procedures before a final resolution may be made, and such a proceeding would not likely serve to 22 develop a recommended policy for the Board; 3. Maintaining established policies is of special importance, so that variations among individual 23 24 decisions are not increased and such a proceeding would not likely reach consistent results among 25 individual decisions; 26 4. The matter significantly affects persons or organizations who are not parties to the proceeding; 27 5. A full public record of the proceeding is important, and a mediation or dispute resolution 28 proceeding cannot provide such a record; and 6 The Board must maintain continuing jurisdiction over the matter with the authority to alter the 29 30 disposition of the matter in light of changed circumstances, and a mediation or dispute resolution 31 proceeding would interfere with the Board's fulfilling that requirement. 32 Mediation and alternative dispute resolution as authorized by this section are voluntary procedures 33 which supplement rather than limit other dispute resolution techniques available to the Boards. 34 B. The decision to employ mediation or a dispute resolution proceeding is in a Board's sole 35 discretion and is not subject to judicial review. 36 C. The outcome of any mediation or dispute resolution proceeding shall not be binding upon a 37 Board, but may be considered by a Board in issuing a permit or promulgating a regulation. 38 D. Each Board shall adopt rules and regulations, in accordance with the Administrative Process Act, 39 for the implementation of this section. Such rules and regulations shall include: (i) standards and 40 procedures for the conduct of mediation and dispute resolution, including notice to and participation by 41 third parties; (ii) the appointment and function of a neutral, as defined in § 8.01-576.4, to encourage 42 and assist parties to voluntarily compromise or settle contested issues; and (iii) procedures to protect 43 the confidentiality of papers, work product or other materials. 44 E. The provisions of § 8.01-576.10 concerning the confidentiality of a mediation or dispute resolution 45 proceeding shall govern all such proceedings held pursuant to this section except where a Board uses or relies on information obtained in the course of such proceeding in issuing a permit or promulgating 46 47 a regulation. **48** Nothing in this section shall be interpreted or applied in a manner inconsistent with the 49 Administrative Process Act (§ 9-6.14:1 et seq.), with applicable federal law or with any applicable requirement for the Commonwealth to obtain or maintain federal delegation or approval of any 50 51 regulatory program.
