AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE (Proposed by the Senate Committee on Rules

on January 28, 1997)

- Memorializing Congress to pass the Integrity Restoration Act or such other legislation which enacts the principles of the Surface Transportation Efficiency Program for the 21st Century.
- 8 WHEREAS, the Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act (ISTEA) of 1991 expires on
 9 September 30, 1997; and

10 WHEREAS, according to the Federal Highway Administration's publication, Federal Highway
 11 Statistics, Virginia consistently receives a lower percentage of federal highway funding than its
 12 percentage share of payments into the Highway Trust Fund; and

WHEREAS, the proposed reauthorization of federal aid for surface transportation programs provides
 an ideal opportunity to ensure that future methods of apportioning federal transportation funds are
 equitable and fair; and

WHEREAS, adequate support for the National Highway System (NHS) is necessary to provide
consistent mobility and economic benefits for all states and the nation, and to ensure that Virginia's
citizens are able to connect with citizens throughout the nation; and

19 WHEREAS, a streamlined transportation program is needed to provide flexible funding to allow20 states and their local partners to respond to specific state and local needs; and

WHEREAS, it is in the national interest to ensure an adequate level of resources for highways in
states with small populations and large land areas, as well as states with small populations and small
land areas; to provide the road systems necessary to facilitate the mobility of citizens across the country
and economic development; and to meet the transportation needs of transit-dependent citizens; and

WHEREAS, multi-modal transportation systems are needed to link the nation's highway systems tothe public transit systems; and

WHEREAS, a strong transit program contributes to national benchmarks for improved air quality by
 reducing pollution as defined by the Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990; and

WHEREAS, the Integrity Restoration Act, which embodies the principles advanced by the Surface
Transportation Efficiency Program (STEP 21) Coalition, has been introduced in both the United States
Senate and the United States House of Representatives; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That Congress be urged to pass the
 Integrity Restoration Act or such other legislation which enacts the principles of the Surface
 Transportation Efficiency Program for the 21st Century. The Congress is urged to reauthorize the federal
 surface transportation program; replace outdated formulas with factors reflecting use, such as those
 identified in the STEP 21 Program; provide better equity in the distribution of highway funds to states;
 and authorize funding for multi-modal transit services and highways; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the Senate transmit copies of this resolution to the
President of the Senate of the United States, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives,
and the members of the Virginia Congressional Delegation in order that they may be apprised of the
sense of the Virginia General Assembly on this matter.
