971837705 **SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 353** 1 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 234567 (Proposed by the Senate Committee on Rules on January 28, 1997) (Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Maxwell) Directing the Disability Commission to study physical access to public buildings by disabled persons. WHEREAS, over 43 million Americans are affected by physical and sensory disabilities, including 8 blindness, deafness, paralysis, muscular and nerve impairment, respiratory affliction, and speech and 9 brain disorders; and 10 WHEREAS, Congress, through passage of the American Disabilities Act, P. L. 101-336, has 11 established a national policy that disabled citizens shall be afforded the assistance that they require to fully participate in every area of society; and 12 WHEREAS, the American Disabilities Act gives civil rights protection to persons with disabilities, 13 14 prohibits discrimination against such persons, and requires that barriers which affect their access to 15 employment and to public accommodations and services be removed; and WHEREAS, among the barriers to be removed are those which impede the physical access of such 16 17 persons to both new and existing facilities; and WHEREAS, employers, businesses, and public agencies are required to comply with the American 18 Disabilities Act to ensure persons with disabilities full access to and participation in public 19 20 accommodations and services; and 21 WHEREAS, barriers to employment, transportation, public accommodations, public services, and telecommunications have, by undermining the efforts to educate, rehabilitate, and employ persons with 22 23 disabilities, imposed staggering economic and social costs our on society; and 24 WHEREAS, the removal of such barriers, particularly physical barriers which impede access to 25 public buildings, facilities, services, and accommodations, will enable society to benefit from the skills and talents of disabled persons, and will enable disabled persons to lead fuller, more productive lives; 26 27 now, therefore, be it 28 RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Disability Commission be 29 directed to study the physical access to public buildings by disabled persons. The Commission shall (i) review the requirements of current federal and state laws relative to the 30 31 rights of persons with disabilities; (ii) determine the extent to which state and local government 32 buildings and facilities are in compliance with such laws; (iii) determine ways to improve and enhance 33 access to public accommodations and services; (iv) consider such other related issues as may be 34 necessary to address the needs of disabled persons in accessing public buildings, accommodations, and 35 services; and (v) offer such recommendations as the Commission may deem necessary and appropriate. 36 Technical assistance shall be provided by the Departments of Housing and Community Development, 37 Rehabilitative Services, and Rights of Virginians with Disabilities. All agencies of the Commonwealth 38 shall provide assistance to the Commission, upon request. 39 The Disability Commission shall complete its work in time to submit its findings and 40 recommendations to the Governor and the 1998 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the 41 procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative 42 documents.

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
