Peters. 4 5 Patrons-Ticer, Colgan, Gartlan, Howell, Saslaw, Whipple and Woods; Delegates: Albo, Brickley, 6 Callahan, Darner, Dillard, Hull, Keating, Moran, Plum, Puller, Rust, Scott, Van Landingham and 7 Watts 8 9 Consent to introduce 10 11 WHEREAS, the Wesley Housing Development Corporation of Northern Virginia was chartered as a nonprofit corporation in 1974 to meet the housing needs of low- and moderate-income families and 12 13 individuals; and 14 WHEREAS, as one of the founders of the organization and its only executive director, Virginia S. 15 Peters has played a major role in the growth of the Wesley Housing Development Corporation into one 16 of the leading affordable housing agencies in Northern Virginia; and WHEREAS, a graduate of Greensboro College in North Carolina and a former elementary school 17 teacher in New Jersey and Arlington, Virginia Peters has led the Wesley Housing Development 18 Corporation since its inception; and 19 20 WHEREAS, under the guidance of Virginia Peters, the corporation solicited volunteers and contributions and established the partnerships and relationships with businesses that have allowed it to 21 22 build, maintain, and manage hundreds of homes for Northern Virginia residents; and 23 WHEREAS, with a current portfolio of over 1,000 residences, including apartments, townhouses, and 24 single family houses, the Wesley Housing Development Corporation is a leader in providing affordable 25 housing; and 26 WHEREAS, Virginia Peters has served Northern Virginia on a wide range of civic organizations, 27 including the Fairfax County Affordable Dwelling Limit Advisory Board, the Washington Area Housing 28 Partnership Board of Directors, and the Northern Virginia Community Development Corporation; and 29 WHEREAS, for her exceptional achievements, Virginia Peters has been recognized as Bridge Builder 30 of the Year by the United Methodist Virginia Conference Commission on the Status and Role of Women, was the first recipient of the Alumni Excellence Award for humanitarian service from the 31 32 Greensboro College Alumni Association, and was given the Church and Society Award by the Virginia 33 Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church; and 34 WHEREAS, Virginia Peters will shortly retire as executive director of the Wesley Housing 35 Development Corporation, thus ending a career of exemplary service and leadership in providing and 36 maintaining decent, affordable housing to the citizens of Northern Virginia; now, therefore, be it 37 RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly hereby 38 commend Virginia S. Peters for her extraordinary commitment to meeting the affordable housing needs 39 of Northern Virginia; and, be it 40 RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the Senate prepare a copy of this resolution for 41 presentation to Virginia S. Peters as an expression of the General Assembly's admiration and gratitude for her manifold accomplishments on behalf of the citizens of Northern Virginia and the 42 43 Commonwealth.
