11	WHEREAS, the late Delegate Dorothy McDiarmid was deeply concerned about education at all
12	levels; and
13 14	WHEREAS, Dorothy McDiarmid wrote the legislation that established kindergartens in the public
15	schools, provided free tuition for the elderly in Virginia's colleges, and mandated appropriate education
16	for the handicapped and retarded; and
17	WHEREAS, during her years in the General Assembly, Dorothy McDiarmid demonstrated her
18	outstanding leadership in advancing public education throughout Virginia, supporting education
19	initiatives that proved critical to the social and economic well-being of the Commonwealth; and
20	WHEREAS, Dorothy McDiarmid was a vigorous advocate on behalf of George Mason University,
21	sponsoring the legislation that founded George Mason College and later established George Mason
22	University as an independent institution; and
23 24	WHEREAS, Dorothy McDiarmid continued to champion the university and fought for its needs
24 25	during its early history, enabling it to become the leading institution, serving 24,000 students, that it is today; and
25 26	WHEREAS, no permanent memorial has been established at George Mason University for Dorothy
20 27	McDiarmid and her husband Hugh, who focused such a significant part of their lives on advancing the
28	causes of George Mason University, education in general, and opportunity for women in politics,
29	governments, and the work place; and
30	WHEREAS, women are traditionally under-represented in the fields of business, engineering, science,
31	and technology, leaving a pool of talent untapped in these important fields; and
32	WHEREAS, women should receive the encouragement and support necessary to enable them to enter
33	these fields for their individual benefit and the economic benefit of the Commonwealth; and
34	WHEREAS, the Women's Advisory Board of George Mason University was established in 1996 to
35	advise and assist George Mason University primarily in the development of programs that will improve
36	women's educational and employment opportunities; now, therefore, be it
37	RESOLVED by the Senate, That the Women's Advisory Board of George Mason University be
38 39	hereby commended for honoring the late Delegate Dorothy McDiarmid and her husband Hugh by establishing an endowment at George Mason University to advance women in the fields of business,
40	engineering, science, and technology; and, be it
41	RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the Senate prepare a copy of this resolution for
42	presentation to the Women's Advisory Board of George Mason University as an expression of the
43	Senate's appreciation for this most fitting tribute to Dorothy and Hugh McDiarmid.
