352 10. The custody of persons in, or sought to be placed in, mental, penal or other state institutions as 353 well as the treatment, supervision, or discharge of such persons.

11. Traffic signs, markers or control devices.

12. Instructions for application or renewal of a license, certificate, or registration required by law.

13. Content of, or rules for the conduct of, any examination required by law.

357 14. The administration of a pool or pools authorized by Article 7.1 (§ 2.1-234.9:1 et seq.) of Chapter 358 14 of Title 2.1.

359 15. Any rules for the conduct of specific lottery games, so long as such rules are not inconsistent 360 with duly adopted regulations of the State Lottery Board, and provided that such regulations are 361 published and posted.

362 16. Orders condemning or closing any shellfish, finfish, or crustacea growing area and the shellfish, finfish or crustacea located thereon pursuant to Article 2 (§ 28.2-803 et seq.) of Chapter 8 of Title 28.2. 363

374 C. The following agency actions otherwise subject to this chapter and § 9-6.18 of the Virginia 375 Register Act are excluded from the operation of Article 2 (§ 9-6.14:7.1 et seq.) of this chapter:

376 1. Agency orders or regulations fixing rates or prices.

377 2. Regulations which establish or prescribe agency organization, internal practice or procedures, 378 including delegations of authority.

379 3. Regulations which consist only of changes in style or form or corrections of technical errors. Each 380 promulgating agency shall review all references to sections of the Code of Virginia within their 381 regulations each time a new supplement or replacement volume to the Code of Virginia is published to 382 ensure the accuracy of each section or section subdivision identification listed. 383

4. Regulations which:

384 (a) Are necessary to conform to changes in Virginia statutory law or the appropriation act where no 385 agency discretion is involved;

386 (b) Are required by order of any state or federal court of competent jurisdiction where no agency 387 discretion is involved; or

388 (c) Are necessary to meet the requirements of federal law or regulations, provided such regulations do not differ materially from those required by federal law or regulation, and the Registrar has so 389 390 determined in writing; notice of the proposed adoption of these regulations and the Registrar's above 391 determination shall be published in the Virginia Register not less than thirty days prior to the effective 392 date thereof.

393 5. Regulations which an agency finds are necessitated by an emergency situation. For the purposes of 394 this subdivision, "emergency situation" means (i) a situation involving an imminent threat to public 395 health or safety or (ii) a situation in which Virginia statutory law or the appropriation act or federal law 396 or federal regulation requires that a regulation shall be effective in 280 days or less from enactment of 397 the law or the appropriation act or the effective date of the federal regulation, and the regulation is not 398 exempt under the provisions of subdivision C 4 of this section. In such cases, the agency shall state in 399 writing the nature of the emergency and of the necessity for such action and may adopt such 400 regulations. Pursuant to § 9-6.14:9, such regulations shall become effective upon approval by the 401 Governor and filing with the Registrar of Regulations. Such regulations shall be limited to no more than 402 twelve months in duration. During the twelve-month period, an agency may issue additional emergency 403 regulations as needed addressing the subject matter of the initial emergency regulation, but any such **404** additional emergency regulations shall not be effective beyond the twelve-month period from the 405 effective date of the initial emergency regulation. If the agency wishes to continue regulating the subject 406 matter governed by the emergency regulation beyond the twelve-month limitation, a regulation to replace 407 the emergency regulation shall be promulgated in accordance with Article 2 (§ 9-6.14:7.1 et seq.) of this 408 chapter. The Notice of Intended Regulatory Action to promulgate a replacement regulation shall be filed 409 with the Registrar within sixty days of the effective date of the emergency regulation and published as 410 soon as practicable, and the proposed replacement regulation shall be filed with the Registrar within 180 411 days after the effective date of the emergency regulation and published as soon as practicable.

Regulations of the regulatory boards served by (i) the Department of Labor and Industry pursuant 419 to Title 40.1 and (ii) the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation or the Department of 420 Health Professions pursuant to Title 54.1 which are limited to reducing fees charged to regulants and 421 applicants.

422 10. The development and issuance of procedural policy relating to risk-based mine inspections by the 423 Department of Mines, Minerals and Energy authorized pursuant to §§ 45.1-161.82 and 45.1-161.292:55.

424 11. General permits issued by the State Air Pollution Control Board pursuant to Chapter 13 425 (§ 10.1-1300 et seq.) of Title 10.1 if the Board: (i) provides a Notice of Intended Regulatory Action in 426 conformance with the provisions of subsection B of § 9-6.14:7.1, (ii) following the passage of thirty 427 days from the publication of the Notice of Intended Regulatory Action forms a technical advisory committee composed of relevant stakeholders, including potentially affected citizens groups, to assist in 428

429 the development of the general permit, (iii) provides notice and receives oral and written comment as provided in subsection F of § 9-6.14:7.1, and (iv) conducts at least one public hearing on the proposed 430 431 general permit.

432 12. General permits issued by the State Water Control Board pursuant to the State Water Control 433 Law (§ 62.1-44.2 et seq.), Chapter 24 (§ 62.1-242 et seq.) of Title 62.1 and Chapter 25 (§ 62.1-254 et 434 seq.) of Title 62.1 if the Board: (i) provides a Notice of Intended Regulatory Action in conformance 435 with the provisions of subsection B of § 9-6.14:7.1, (ii) following the passage of thirty days from the publication of the Notice of Intended Regulatory Action forms a technical advisory committee composed 436 437 of relevant stakeholders, including potentially affected citizens groups, to assist in the development of 438 the general permit, (iii) provides notice and receives oral and written comment as provided in subsection 439 F of § 9-6.14:7.1, and (iv) conducts at least one public hearing on the proposed general permit.

13. The development and issuance by the Board of Education of guidelines on constitutional rights 440 441 and restrictions relating to the recitation of the pledge of allegiance to the American flag in public 442 schools pursuant to § 22.1-202.

443 14. Regulations of the Board of the Virginia Higher Education Tuition Trust Fund promulgated 444 pursuant to § 23-38.77.

445 15. The development and issuance of general wetlands permits by the Marine Resources Commission 446 pursuant to subsection B of § 28.2-1307 if the Commission: (i) provides a Notice of Intended Regulatory 447 Action in conformance with the provisions of subsection B of § 9-6.14:7.1, (ii) following the passage of 448 thirty days from publication of the Notice of Intended Regulatory Action forms a technical advisory 449 committee composed of relevant stake holders, including potentially affected citizens groups, to assist in 450 the development of the general permit, (iii) provides notice and receives oral and written comment as provided in subsection F of § 9-6.14:7.1, and (iv) conducts at least one public hearing on the proposed 451 452 general permit.

453 Whenever regulations are adopted under this subsection C, the agency shall state as part thereof that 454 it will receive, consider and respond to petitions by any interested person at any time with respect to 455 reconsideration or revision. The effective date of regulations adopted under this subsection shall be in 456 accordance with the provisions of § 9-6.14:9.3, except in the case of emergency regulations, which shall 457 become effective as provided in subsection A of § 9-6.14:9.

D. The following agency actions otherwise subject to this chapter are excluded from the operation of 458 459 Article 3 (§ 9-6.14:11 et seq.) of this chapter:

460 1. The assessment of taxes or penalties and other rulings in individual cases in connection with the 461 administration of the tax laws.

462 2. The award or denial of claims for workers' compensation.

3. The grant or denial of public assistance. 463

464 4. Temporary injunctive or summary orders authorized by law. 465

5. The determination of claims for unemployment compensation or special unemployment.

466 6. The suspension of any license, certificate, registration or authority granted any person by the Department of Health Professions or the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation for the 467 468 dishonor, by a bank or financial institution named, of any check, money draft or similar instrument used 469 in payment of a fee required by statute or regulation.

470 E. Appeals from decisions of the Governor's Employment and Training Department otherwise subject 471 to this chapter are excluded from the operation of Article 4 (§ 9-6.14:15 et seq.) of this chapter.

472 F. The Marine Resources Commission, otherwise subject to this chapter and § 9-6.18 of the Virginia Register Act, is excluded from the operation of subdivision C 5 of this section and of Article 2 473 474 (\$9-6.14:7.1 et seq.) of this chapter.

475 G. A regulation for which an exemption is claimed under this section and which is placed before a 476 board or commission for consideration shall be provided at least two days in advance of the board or 477 commission meeting to members of the public that request a copy of that regulation. A copy of that 478 regulation shall be made available to the public attending such meeting.

479 H. The Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall conduct a review periodically of 480 exemptions and exclusions authorized by this section. The purpose of this review shall be to assess 481 whether there are any exemptions or exclusions which should be discontinued or modified.

482 I. Minor changes to regulations being published in the Virginia Administrative Code under the 483 Virginia Register Act, Chapter 1.2 (§ 9-6.15 et seq.) of this title, made by the Virginia Code **484** Commission pursuant to § 9-77.10:1 shall be exempt from the provisions of this chapter. 485

# CHAPTER 21.

# VIRGINIA INFORMATION ACCESS ACT OF 1998.

§ 22.1-355. Purpose of chapter.

578 It is hereby found, determined, and declared that information access through computer hardware, 579 software programs, databases, networks, and information systems which are supported in whole or in part by the general funds of the Commonwealth is a privilege and not a right. The purpose of this 580 chapter, which may be cited as the "Virginia Information Access Act of 1998," is to create and empower 581 a policy board to develop, design, deploy, maintain, and update information access for (i) students in 582 583 the Commonwealth's public elementary and secondary schools who are under the age of eighteen and 584 (ii) patrons of the Commonwealth's public libraries who are under the age of eighteen. 585

§ 22.1-356. Board created; membership; terms; meetings; quorum; compensation.

A. There is hereby created the Board for Information Access (the "Board") as a policy board within 586 the meaning of § 9-6.25:2. The Board shall consist of the nine members of the Board of Education appointed pursuant to § 22.1-9, the Superintendent of Public Instruction appointed pursuant to 587 588 § 22.1-21, the fifteen members of the Library Board appointed pursuant to § 42.1-2, and the State Librarian appointed pursuant to § 42.1-13. In even-numbered years, the Superintendent of Public 589 590 Instruction shall be the chairman of the Board. In odd-numbered years, the State Librarian shall be the 591 chairman of the Board. The Board may elect from among its membership such other officers as it deems 592 593 necessary, convenient, or desirable to properly and efficiently discharge its duties. Board members shall serve terms coincident with the terms of their gubernatorial appointments. 594

595 B. Upon the call of the chairman, the Board may meet as often as is necessary, convenient, or 596 desirable to properly and efficiently discharge its duties, but not less than once every three months. 597 Unless otherwise specified in this chapter, a majority of the members of the Board shall constitute a 598 quorum for the transaction of its business. C. Pursuant to § 2.1-20.3, Board members shall be entitled to receive compensation for their service

- 599 600 and to be reimbursed reasonable and necessary expenses incurred for attending Board meetings.
- § 22.1-357. Powers and duties. 601
- The Board shall have the following powers and duties: 602
- 603 1. To develop and design the Virginia Information Access Intranet (the "VIAI") created pursuant to 604 § 22.1-358.
- 2. To deploy the VIAI on July 1, 1999, and to continue to provide it thereafter, free of any fees or 605 606 charges, to the Commonwealth's public elementary and secondary schools and public libraries. 607
  - 3. To maintain and update the VIAI and ensure that its content furthers the purposes of this Act.
- 608 4. To sell or license the VIAI and any updates thereto under such terms and conditions and at such prices as the Board deems appropriate, to deposit the proceeds from the sale or license of the VIAI and 609 any updates thereto into the Virginia Information Access Intranet Fund (the "VIAIF") created pursuant 610 to § 22.1-359, and to administer the VIAIF consistent with the purposes of this Act. 611
- 612 § 22.1-358. Virginia Information Access Intranet created; content; maintenance and updates.
- A. The Board shall develop, design, deploy, maintain, and update the Virginia Information Access 613

614 Intranet (the "VIAI"). The VIAI shall be an electronic information network which connects the 615 community of interest shared by (i) students in the Commonwealth's public elementary and secondary 616 schools who are under the age of eighteen and (ii) patrons of the Commonwealth's public libraries who are under the age of eighteen. Consistent with the finding, determination, and declaration of this Act 617 618 that information access through computer hardware, software programs, databases, networks, and 619 information systems which are supported in whole or in part by the general funds of the Commonwealth 620 is a privilege and not a right, the VIAI shall consist of information and material which furthers 621 purposes, pursuits, or endeavors related to education; instruction; research; world, national, state, or 622 local government events and affairs; and public service and civic duties. The Board shall not include in the VIAI any information or material which (i) is in violation of any federal, state, or local law; (ii) 623 624 infringes upon the rights of any person; (iii) is defamatory, threatening, abusive, obscene, profane, 625 pornographic, or lascivious; (iv) constitutes an advertisement, solicitation, or political lobbying; or (v)encourages or incites the use of controlled dangerous substances, alcohol, tobacco, or other illegal 626 627 products or activities.

628 B. Upon written request to the Board from a member of (i) the Board for Information Access, (ii) a 629 local school board appointed or elected pursuant to § 22.1-29, or (iii) a library board appointed 630 pursuant to § 42.1-35, the Board shall consider the addition or deletion of information or materials 631 from the VIAI. Upon a two-thirds vote of the total membership of the Board, requests to delete 632 information or materials shall be granted. Upon a majority vote of a quorum of the Board, requests to 633 add information or material to the VIAI shall be granted.

C. The VIAI and its development, design, deployment, maintenance, and updates shall, for all purposes, be held and owned as the intellectual property of the Commonwealth. Upon such terms, conditions, and prices as the Board deems appropriate, the Board may sell or license the VIAI and any updates thereto to any person or entity desiring to purchase or license same. Prior to execution, the form of any agreement to sell or license the VIAI shall be subject to approval by the Attorney General.
§ 22.1-359. Virginia Information Access Intranet Fund created; purposes.

A. There is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the
Virginia Information Access Intranet Fund (the "VIAIF"). The VIAIF shall be established on the books
of the Comptroller. All proceeds from sales or licensing of the VIAI and any updates thereto shall be
paid into the state treasury and credited to the VIAIF. Interest earned on moneys in the VIAIF shall
remain in the VIAIF and be credited to it. Any moneys remaining the VIAIF, including interest thereon,
at the end of each fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund but shall remain in the VIAIF.

646 B. Moneys in the VIAIF shall be used by the Board to further the purposes of this Act in developing, 647 designing, deploying, maintaining, and updating information access for (i) students in the 648 Commonwealth's public elementary and secondary schools who are under the age of eighteen and (ii) 649 patrons of the Commonwealth's public libraries who are under the age of eighteen. Such uses may include purchasing or leasing computer hardware, software programs, databases, networks, and 650 information systems for or on behalf of the Commonwealth's public elementary and secondary schools 651 652 and public libraries; providing training or retraining for teachers, librarians, administrators, and staff 653 of the Commonwealth's public elementary and secondary schools and public libraries; and supplying the 654 Board with adequate and appropriate staff to support the technical and nontechnical requirements to 655 develop, design, deploy, maintain, and update the VIAI.

656 *C. Expenditures and disbursements from the VIAIF shall be made by the State Treasurer on warrants issued by the Comptroller upon written request signed by the chairman of the Board.* 

658 § 22.1-360. Exemption from Administrative Process Act; Board staff and additional support.

659 A. The Board shall be exempt from the Administrative Process Act (§ 9-6.14:1 et seq.), but shall 660 comply the Virginia Register Act (§ 9-6.15 et seq.).

661 B. Staff shall be provided to the Board by the Department of Education and the Library of Virginia 662 and from such funds appropriated by the General Assembly to further the purposes of this Act. Upon the 663 Board's request, the Council on Information Management (or its successor agency or office) and the 664 Department of Information Technology (or its successor agency) shall provide additional assistance and 665 support to the Board.

666 § 22.1-361. Obligations of public schools and libraries; violations; Governor authorized to withhold 667 general funds.

A. Consistent with the finding, determination, and declaration of this Act that information access through computer hardware, software programs, databases, networks, and information systems which are supported in whole or in part by the general funds of the Commonwealth is a privilege and not a right, on and after July 1, 1999, no public elementary or secondary school or public library in this Commonwealth shall provide access to the international network of computer systems commonly known as the Internet to (i) students in the Commonwealth's public elementary and secondary schools who are under the age of eighteen and (ii) patrons of the Commonwealth's public libraries who are under the

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676 B. Upon written recommendation from the Board to the Governor that a public elementary or
677 secondary school or public library in this Commonwealth has violated subsection A of this section, the
678 Governor is authorized to direct the Comptroller to withhold the distribution of all or part of the
679 general funds of this Commonwealth to such school or library until such violation is remedied.
