A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 2.1-1.6 and 9-6.25:1 of the Code of Virginia and to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Title 3.1 a chapter numbered 45, consisting of sections numbered 3.1-1104 through 3.1-1108, and by adding sections numbered 58.1-333.1 and 58.1-430.1, relating to the Virginia Charity Food Assistance Act.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That §§ 2.1-1.6 and 9-6.25:1 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted, and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Title 3.1 a chapter numbered 45, consisting of sections numbered 3.1-1104 through 3.1-1108, and by adding a sections numbered 58.1-333.1 and 58.1-430.1 as follows:

§ 2.1-1.6. State boards.

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A. There shall be, in addition to such others as may be established by law, the following permanent collegial bodies affiliated with a state agency within the executive branch:

182	VIRGINIA CHARITY FOOD ASSISTANCE ACT.

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§ 3.1-1104. Definitions.

As used in this chapter, unless the context requires a different meaning:

"Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Consumer Services.

"Business firm" means any corporation, partnership, electing small business (Subchapter S) corporation, limited liability company, or sole proprietorship authorized to do business in this Commonwealth subject to tax imposed by Articles 2 (§ 58.1-320 et seq.) and 10 (§ 58.1-400 et seq.) of Chapter 3, Chapter 12 (§ 58.1-1200 et seq.), Article 1 (§ 58.1-2500 et seq.) of Chapter 25, or Article 2 (§ 58.1-2620 et seq.) of Chapter 26 of Title 58.1.

"Charity food provider" means a nonprofit, charitable organization which operates on a continuing basis as a food pantry, soup kitchen, community kitchen, emergency shelter, or other program which seeks to relieve the incidence of hunger, undernutrition, or short-term food or nutritional shortages among needy individuals and families, homeless people, or victims of domestic violence.

"Commissioner" means the Commissioner of the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services.

"Department" means the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services.

"Food bank" means a nonprofit charitable organization that (i) is exempt from income taxation under the provisions of §§ 501 (c) (3) and 501 (c) (4) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended from time to time, and (ii) distributes food to charity food providers.

§ 3.1-1105. Virginia Charity Food Assistance Advisory Board.

A. There is hereby established within the Department the Virginia Charity Food Assistance Advisory Board, which shall advise the Board and the Department on the implementation of the Virginia charity food donation tax credit and the Virginia Charity Food Purchase Program and study programs or other ways the Department or other agencies might help to reduce the incidence of hunger, undernutrition, and short-term food or nutritional shortages among the needy. The Advisory Board shall consist of twelve members to be appointed by the Governor, and shall include one of representative each of the following: a statewide agriculture organization, the Virginia Cooperative Extension Service, the wholesale grocery industry, the retail grocery industry, the food processing industry, the dairy industry, the poultry industry, and the bottling industry. Four members shall represent food banks.

B. The Advisory Board shall annually elect a chairman from among its members. The chairman shall fix the times and places of meetings. Members of the Advisory Board shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for their reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of

their duties as Advisory Board members.

3.1-1106. Charity Food Purchase Program; regulations; contracts; reports.

A The Virginia Charity Food Purchase Program is hereby established. The Program shall be administered by the Department. The purpose of the Program shall be to provide food and grocery products to food banks for distribution to charity food providers. The Board shall promulgate regulations to govern the Department's purchase and distribution of food and grocery products under the Program and shall seek the assistance of the Charity Food Assistance Advisory Board in developing such regulations. The Department may, in implementing the Program, enter into contracts with food banks. Food purchases made by the Department shall be made in accordance with the Virginia Public Procurement Act (§ 11-35 et seq.). No person may be charged for food or encouraged to contribute money in order to receive food under the Program.

B. Within ninety days after the end of each fiscal year, any food bank receiving food under the Program shall submit to the Commissioner an annual report disclosing the types and amounts of food and grocery products distributed to charity food providers under the Program.

C. Within 180 days after the end of each fiscal year, the Commissioner shall report to the Chairmen of the House Appropriations and Senate Finance Committees the types and amounts of food distributed to food banks and charity food providers under the Program.

§ 3.1-1107. Allocation of tax credits authorized; requests; regulations.

A. Any food bank may submit a request to the Commissioner for an allocation of tax credits for use by business firms making donations of food or grocery products to the food bank. The request shall set forth the type and amount of food or grocery products expected to be donated, the number of charity food providers that will benefit from such donations, and the estimated number of persons or households that will benefit from such donation.

B. The Board shall promulgate regulations for the approval of such requests. Such regulations shall include a requirement that an annual audit to be provided by the food bank as a prerequisite for approval. Such regulations shall provide for the equitable allocation of the available amount of tax credits among the approved requests. The Board shall seek the assistance of the Charity Food Assistance Advisory Board in developing the regulations.

C. If the Commissioner approves a request, the food bank shall make the allocated tax credit available to business firms making donations of food or grocery products. A food bank may not transfer

or assign an allocation of tax credits to another food bank without the approval of the Commissioner.

D. Through June 30, 2000, the total amount of tax credits granted for programs approved under this chapter for each fiscal year shall not exceed \$5,000,000. Tax credits shall not be authorized after fiscal year 2000.

§ 3.1-1108. Tax credit reporting and eligibility.

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A. The Commissioner shall certify to the Department of Taxation, or in the case of business firms subject to tax under Article 1 (§ 58.1-2500 et seq.) of Chapter 25 or Article 2 (§ 58.1-2620 et seq.) of Chapter 26 of Title 58.1, to the State Corporation Commission, the applicability of the tax credit provided in this section for business firms.

B. A business firm shall be eligible for a credit against the taxes imposed by Articles 2 (§ 58.1-320) et seq.) and 10 (§ 58.1-400 et seq.) of Chapter 3, Chapter 12 (§ 58.1-1200 et seq.), Article 1 (§ 58.1-2500 et seq.) of Chapter 25, or Article 2 (§ 58.1-2620 et seq.) of Chapter 26 of Title 58.1, as applicable, in the amount of fifty percent of the fair market value of the food or grocery products donated by the business firm during its taxable year to a food bank to which tax credits have been allocated pursuant to § 3.1-1107. No tax credit of less than \$500 shall be granted for any donation, and a business firm shall not be allowed a tax credit in excess of \$500,000 per taxable year. No tax credit shall be granted to any business firm for donations to a food bank providing food assistance to employees of the business firm. Any tax credit not usable for the taxable year the donation was made may be carried over to the extent usable for the next five succeeding taxable years or until the full credit has been utilized, whichever is sooner. Credits granted to a partnership, electing small business (Subchapter S) corporation or limited liability company shall be allocated to their individual partners, shareholders, or members, respectively, in proportion to their ownership or interest in such business

C. The Commissioner or his designee shall issue a tax credit to a business firm upon receipt of a certification made by a food bank to which tax credits have been allocated pursuant to § 3.1-1107. The certification shall identify the date, type, amount and value of the food or grocery products donation received by the food bank and the business firm making the donation. A business entity shall be eligible for a tax credit under this section only to the extent that sufficient tax credits allocated to a food bank are available.

§ 58.1-430.1. Virginia charity food donation tax credit.

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Any business firm, as defined in § 3.1-1104, shall be allowed a credit against the tax imposed by Article 10 (§ 58.1-400 et seq.) of this chapter of an amount equal to fifty percent of the fair market value of the food or grocery products donated by the business firm during its taxable year to a food bank to which tax credits have been allocated as provided in § 3.1-1107.
