That §§ 9-6.25:1, 9-341, 9-342, 9-343, and 9-346 of the Code of Virginia are amended and 9 reenacted as follows: 10 § 9-6.25:1. - **133** § 9-341. Definitions.
- As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:
- 135 "Commercial activity" means performing services or providing goods which can normally be 136 obtained from private enterprise.
- 137 "Commercial source" means any business or other concern that is eligible for a contract award in138 accordance with the Virginia Public Procurement Act.
- **139** "Competitive process" means the process approved by the Council to determine the most **140** cost-effective privatization technique.
- 141 "Council" means the Commonwealth Competition Council.
- 142 "Fully allocated cost" means a cost which includes all direct personnel costs, materials and supplies,
 143 equipment, capital and equipment depreciation costs, rent, maintenance and repairs, utilities, insurance,
 144 travel, operations overhead, and general administrative overhead as these terms are defined in the
 145 Council's "Compete" cost comparison program.
- 146 "Managed competition" means a competitive process between a state agency and the private sector
 147 in which (i) the state agency submits its own proposal after completing the fully allocated cost of the
 148 commercial activity and (ii) the proposal is based on its most efficient proposed organization to compete
 149 with a private sector bid or proposal for the provision of the commercial activity.
- 150 "Privatization" means a variety of techniques and activities which promote more involvement of the 151 private sector in providing services that have traditionally been provided by government. It also includes 152 methods of providing a portion or all of select government-provided or government-produced programs 153 and services through the private sector.
- 154 "State agency" means any board, council, authority, department, agency, or institution of the 155 Commonwealth which employs state or nonstate personnel.
- 156 § 9-342. Commonwealth Competition Council created; duties.
- 157 There is hereby created in the executive branch the Commonwealth Competition Council. The 158 Council shall:
- 159 1. Examine and promote methods of providing a portion or all of select government-provided or government-produced programs and services through the private sector by a competitive contracting program, and advise the Governor, the General Assembly, and executive branch agencies of the Council's findings and recommendations.
- 163 2. Develop an institutional framework for a statewide competitive program to encourage innovation 164 and competition within state government.
- 165 3. Establish a system to encourage the use of feasibility studies and innovation to determine where 166 competition could reduce government costs without harming the public.
- 4. Monitor the products and services of state agencies to bring an element of competition and toensure a spirit of innovation and entrepreneurship to compete with the private sector.
- 169 5. Advocate, develop and accelerate implementation of a competitive program for state entities to
 170 ensure competition for the provision or production of government services, or both, from both public
 171 and private sector entities.
- 172 6. Establish approval, planning, and reporting processes required to carry out the functions of the173 Council.
- 174 7. Determine the privatization potential of a program or activity; perform cost/benefit analyses; and
 175 conduct public and private performance analyses. The Secretary of Finance shall independently certify
 176 the results of the comparison.
- 8. Devise, in consultation with the Secretary of Finance, evaluation criteria to be used in conductingperformance reviews of any program or activity which is subject to a privatization recommendation.

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179 9. To the extent practicable and to the extent that resources are available, make its services available 180 for a fair compensation to any political subdivision of the Commonwealth.

181 10. Review the practices of government agencies and nonprofit organizations which may constitute 182 inappropriate competition with private enterprise. The Council shall develop proposals for (i) preserving 183 the traditional role of private enterprise; (ii) encouraging the expansion of existing, and the creation of 184 new, private enterprise; and (iii) monitoring inappropriate competition by nonprofit organizations.

§ 9-343. Membership; appointment; terms; vacancies; chairman; quorum; compensation. 185

A. The Council shall be composed of ten *fifteen* members to be appointed as follows: four employees 186 of executive branch agencies to be appointed by the Governor; one member two members of the House 187 of Delegates to be appointed by the Speaker of the House; one member two members of the Senate to 188 189 be appointed by the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections; two three members of the private 190 sector to be appointed by the Governor; one member two members of the private sector to be appointed 191 by the Speaker of the House; and one member two members of the private sector, who shall be private 192 sector members of the Small Business Commission, to be appointed by the Senate Committee on 193 Privileges and Elections.

194 B. Legislative members shall serve on the Council until the expiration of their terms of office or 195 until their successors shall qualify. Two of the members who are employees of executive branch 196 agencies and one member from the private sector appointed by the Governor shall be appointed for 197 terms of one year. Two of the members who are employees of executive branch agencies and one 198 member two members from the private sector appointed by the Governor shall be appointed for terms of 199 two years. The nonlegislative members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates and the 200 Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections shall be appointed for terms of three years. Thereafter all 201 nonlegislative members of the Council shall be appointed for terms of three years.

C. Appointments to fill vacancies shall be for the unexpired terms. No person shall be eligible to 202 203 serve for or during more than two successive three-year terms. Executive branch agency members shall 204 serve only as long as they retain their positions. 205

D. The Council shall annually elect its chairman and vice chairman from among its members.

206 E. Six Eight members of the Council shall constitute a quorum. No action shall be taken by the 207 Council without the concurrence of at least six eight members.

208 F. Legislative members shall be compensated as specified in § 14.1-18, and all members of the 209 Council shall be reimbursed for their actual expenses incurred in the performance of their duties. 210

§ 9-346. Unsolicited proposals.

The Governor or the General Assembly may direct any state agency to perform a public/private 211 212 performance analysis covering any service commercial activity for which the Council has received a 213 qualifying unsolicited proposal from a private entity which is consistent with the Council's purposes and 214 duties as provided in § 9-342.

215 The provisions of this section shall not apply to transportation-related projects initiated pursuant to Chapter 22 (§ 56-556 et seq.) of Title 56. 216

2. That the provisions of this act shall not affect the terms of members currently serving on the 217 218 **Commonwealth Competition Council.**

219 3. That Chapter 42 (§§ 9-330 through 9-333) of Title 9 of the Code of Virginia is repealed.
