6	A BILL to amend and reenact § 15.2-1500 of the Code of Virginia, relating to organization of local
7	government.
8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. That § 15.2-1500 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
10	§ 15.2-1500. Organization of local government.
11	Every locality shall provide for all the governmental functions of the locality, including, without
12	limitation, the organization of all departments, offices, boards, commissions and agencies of government,
13	and the organizational structure thereof, which are necessary and the employment of the officers and
14	other employees needed to carry out the functions of government. Notwithstanding any other provision
15	of law, general or special, no locality shall establish any department, office, board, commission, agency
16	or other governmental division or entity which has authority to offer telecommunications equipment,
17	infrastructure, other than pole or tower attachments including antennas or conduit occupancy, or
18	services, other than intragovernmental radio dispatch or paging systems shared by adjoining localities,
19 20	for sale or lease to any person or entity other than (i) such locality's departments, offices, boards,
20	commissions, agencies or other governmental divisions or entities or (ii) an adjoining locality's
21 22	departments, offices, boards, commissions, agencies or other governmental divisions or entities, so long as any charges for such telecommunications equipment, infrastructure and services do not exceed the
$\frac{22}{23}$	cost to the providing locality of providing such equipment, infrastructure on services. However, any town
23 24	which is located adjacent to Exit 17 on Interstate 81 and which offered telecommunications services to
25	the public on January 1, 1998, is hereby authorized to continue to offer such telecommunications
26	services, but shall not acquire by eminent domain the facilities or other property of any telephone
27	company or cable operator. Any locality may sell any telecommunications infrastructure, including
28	related equipment, which such locality had constructed prior to September 1, 1998, and such locality
29	may receive from the purchaser or purchasers, as full or partial consideration for the sale of such
30	infrastructure, communications services to be used solely for internal use of the locality. Any locality
31	which sells such infrastructure, including related equipment, may, at its option, exclude the incumbent
32	local exchange carrier from the bid or other sale process.
33	2. That the provisions of this act shall expire on July 1, 2000.
