Patron-Nixon 8 Referred to Committee on General Laws 9 10 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That §§ 54.1-1100, 54.1-1101 and 54.1-1108.2 of the Code of Virginia are amended and 11 reenacted as follows: 12 § 54.1-1100. Definitions. 13 14 As used in this chapter, unless the context requires a different meaning: 15 "Board" means the Board for Contractors. "Class A contractors" perform or manage construction, removal, repair, or improvements when (i) the 16 17 total value referred to in a single contract or project is \$70,000 or more, or (ii) the total value of all such construction, removal, repair, or improvements undertaken by such person within any twelve-month 18 19 period is \$500,000 or more. 20 "Class B contractors" perform or manage construction, removal, repair, or improvements when (i) the 21 total value referred to in a single contract or project is \$7,500 or more, but less than \$70,000, or (ii) the total value of all such construction, removal, repair or improvements undertaken by such person within 22 23 any twelve-month period is \$150,000 or more, but less than \$500,000. "Class C contractors" perform or manage construction, removal, repair, or improvements when (i) the 24 25 total value referred to in a single contract or project is over \$1,000 but no more less than \$7,500, or (ii) the total value of all such construction, removal, repair, or improvements undertaken by such person 26 within any twelve-month period is no more less than \$150,000. The Board shall require a master 27 28 tradesmen license as a condition of licensure for electrical, plumbing and heating, ventilation and air 29 conditioning contractors. 30 "Contractor" means any person, that for a fixed price, commission, fee, or percentage undertakes to 31 bid upon, or accepts, or offers to accept, orders or contracts for performing, managing, or superintending 32 in whole or in part, the construction, removal, repair or improvement of any building or structure 33 permanently annexed to real property owned, controlled, or leased by another person or any other 34 improvements to such real property. 35 'Department" means the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation. 36 "Designated employee" means the contractor's full-time employee who is at least eighteen years of 37 age and who has successfully completed the oral or written examination required by the Board on behalf 38 of the contractor. 39 "Director" means the Director of the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation. 40 "Owner-developer" means any person who performs or supervises the construction, removal, repair 41 or improvements of any building or structure permanently annexed to real property owned, controlled or leased by him or any other improvements to such property when either (i) the total value of all such 42 improvements to or upon any single parcel of land is \$70,000 or more or (ii) the total value of all such 43 improvements to or upon all real property undertaken by him within any twelve-month period is 44 \$500,000 or more, but shall not include a person who performs or supervises the construction, removal, 45 repair or improvement of (i) not more than one building upon his own real property and for his own use 46 47 during any twenty-four-month period, (ii) a house upon his own real property as a bona fide gift to a **48** member of his immediate family provided such member lives in the house for at least twenty-four 49 months, (iii) industrial or manufacturing facilities for his own use, or (iv) any person who contracts with 50 a duly licensed Class A contractor classified as a building contractor to perform such construction, 51 removal, repair or improvements. 52 For purposes of this section, "immediate family" includes one's mother, father, son, daughter, brother, 53 sister, grandchild, grandparent, mother-in-law and father-in-law. 54 "Person" means any individual, firm, corporation, association, partnership, joint venture, or other 55 legal entity. "Value" means fair market value. When improvements are performed or supervised by a contractor, 56

The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to: 59

the contract price shall be prima facie evidence of value.

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60 1. Any governmental agency performing work with its own forces;

61 2. Work bid upon or undertaken for the armed services of the United States under the Armed62 Services Procurement Act;

63 3. Work bid upon or undertaken for the United States government on land under the exclusive64 jurisdiction of the federal government either by statute or deed of cession;

65 4. Work bid upon or undertaken for the Department of Transportation on the construction, 66 reconstruction, repair or improvement of any highway or bridge;

5. Any other persons who may be specifically excluded by other laws but only to such an extent assuch laws provide; and

69 6. Any material supplier who renders advice concerning use of products sold and who does not provide construction or installation services.;

71 7. Any person who performs or supervises the construction, removal, repair or improvement of not
72 more than one building upon his own real property and for his own use during any twenty-four-month
73 period;

8. Any person who performs or supervises the construction, removal, repair or improvement of a house upon his own real property as a bona fide gift to a member of his immediate family provided such member lives in the house for at least twenty-four months. For purposes of this section, "immediate family" includes one's mother, father, son, daughter, brother, sister, grandchild, grandparent, mother-in-law and father-in-law; and

79 9. Any person who performs or supervises the construction, removal, repair or improvement of
 80 industrial or manufacturing facilities for his own use.

81 All other contractors performing work for any government or for any governmental agency are 82 subject to the provisions of this chapter and are required to be licensed as provided herein.

83 § 54.1-1108.2. Application for Class C license; fees; issuance.

A. Any person desiring to be licensed as a Class C contractor shall file with the Department a
written application on a form prescribed by the Board. The application shall be accompanied by a fee
set by the Board pursuant to § 54.1-201. The application shall contain information concerning the name,
location, nature, and operation of the business, as well as information demonstrating that the applicant
possesses the character and minimum skills to properly engage in the occupation of contracting, and an
affidavit stating that the information on the application is correct.

B. The Board may grant a Class C license in any of the following classifications: (i) building
contractor, (ii) highway/heavy contractor, and (iii) electrical contractor, (iv) plumbing contractor, (v)
HVAC contractor, and (vi) specialty contractor.
