- 365 § 13.1-549. Qualifications of shareholders; special provisions for corporations rendering services of
 366 architects, professional engineers, land surveyors and certified landscape architects.

367 A corporation rendering the services of architects, professional engineers, land surveyors and certified 368 landscape architects, or any combination thereof, shall issue not less than two-thirds of its capital stock 369 to individuals duly licensed or otherwise legally authorized to render the services of architect, 370 professional engineer, land surveyor or certified landscape architect, and the remainder of said stock may 371 be issued only to and held by individuals who are employees of the corporation whether or not such 372 employees be are licensed or otherwise authorized to render professional services. No other professional 373 corporation may issue any of its capital stock to anyone other than an individual who is duly licensed or 374 otherwise legally authorized to render the same specific professional services as those for which the 375 corporation was incorporated. Notwithstanding the above limitations a professional corporation may issue 376 its stock to a partnership each of the partners of which is duly licensed or otherwise legally authorized to render the same professional services as those for which the corporation was incorporated. 377

378 It is further provided, as an additional prerequisite for a corporation engaging in the practice of the 379 professions of architecture, professional engineering, land surveying, or certified landscape architecture 380 or any combination thereof, that such corporation shall secure a certificate of authority, which may be 381 renewable and may be either general or limited, from the State Board for Architects, Professional 382 Engineers, Land Surveyors, Certified Interior Designers and Landscape Architects. Such certificate of 383 authority shall be issued or renewed by the State Board when in its discretion such corporation is in 384 compliance with rules and regulations which shall be promulgated by the said State Board consistent 385 with its jurisdiction to provide adequate safeguards for the public's health, welfare and safety. The fees 386 for a certificate of authority as described above shall be the same fees as provided for in Chapter 4 387 (§ 54.1-600 et seq.) of Title 54.1 of the Code.

388 § 13.1-1111. Qualifications of members and managers; special provisions for limited liability
 389 companies rendering service of architects, professional engineers, land surveyors and certified landscape
 390 architects.

391 Not less than two-thirds of the membership interests of a professional limited liability company 392 rendering the services of architects, professional engineers, land surveyors and certified landscape 393 architects, or any combination thereof, shall be held by individuals or professional business entities duly licensed or otherwise legally authorized to render the services of architects, professional engineers, land 394 395 surveyors or certified landscape architects, and the remainder of the membership interests may be held 396 only by individuals who are employees of the professional limited liability company whether or not 397 those employees are licensed or otherwise authorized to render professional services. No other 398 professional limited liability company may have as a member anyone other than an individual or a 399 professional business entity that is duly licensed or otherwise legally authorized to render the same 400 professional services as those for which the professional limited liability company was organized.

401 As an additional prerequisite for a professional limited liability company's engaging in the practice of 402 the professions of architecture, professional engineering, land surveying, or certified landscape 403 architecture, or any combination thereof, that professional limited liability company shall secure a **404** certificate of authority, which may be renewable and may be either general or limited, from the State 405 Board for Architects, Professional Engineers, Land Surveyors, Certified Interior Designers and 406 Landscape Architects. The certificate of authority shall be issued or renewed by the State Board when in 407 its discretion the professional limited liability company is in compliance with rules and regulations 408 which shall be promulgated by the State Board consistent with its jurisdiction to provide adequate 409 safeguards for the public's health, welfare and safety. The fees for a certificate of authority as described 410 above shall be the same fees as provided for in Chapter 4 (§ 54.1-400 et seq.) of Title 54.1.

411 § 22.1-140. Plans for buildings to be approved by division superintendent.

412 No public school building or addition or alteration thereto, for either permanent or temporary use, 413 shall be advertised for bid, contracted for, erected, or otherwise acquired until the plans and specifications therefor have been approved in writing by the division superintendent and are 414 415 accompanied by a statement by an architect or professional engineer licensed by the Virginia Board for 416 Architects, Professional Engineers, Land Surveyors, Certified Interior Designers and Landscape 417 Architects that such plans and specifications are, in his professional opinion and belief, in compliance 418 with the regulations of the Board of Education and the Uniform Statewide Building Code. The division 419 superintendent's approval, architect's or engineer's statement, and a copy of the final plans and 420 specifications shall be submitted to the Superintendent of Public Instruction.

421 § 54.1-300. Definitions.

422 As used in this chapter unless the context requires a different meaning:

423 "Board" means the Board for Professional and Occupational Regulation.

424 "Certification" means the process whereby the Department or any regulatory board issues a certificate
425 on behalf of the Commonwealth to a person certifying that he possesses the character and minimum
426 skills to engage properly in his profession or occupation.

427 "Department" means the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation.

428 "Director" means the Director of the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation.

"Inspection" means a method of regulation whereby a state agency periodically examines the activities and premises of practitioners of an occupation or profession to ascertain if the practitioner is carrying out his profession or occupation in a manner consistent with the public health, safety and welfare.

433 "Licensure" means a method of regulation whereby the Commonwealth, through the issuance of a
434 license, authorizes a person possessing the character and minimum skills to engage in the practice of a
435 profession or occupation which is unlawful to practice without a license.

436 "Registration" means a method of regulation whereby any practitioner of a profession or occupation437 may be required to submit information concerning the location, nature and operation of his practice.

438 "Regulatory board" means the Athletic Board, Auctioneers Board, Board for Accountancy, Board for
439 Architects, Professional Engineers, Land Surveyors, *Certified Interior Designers* and Landscape
440 Architects, Board for Barbers, Board for Branch Pilots, Board for Contractors, Board for Cosmetology,
441 Board for Geology, Board for Hearing Aid Specialists, Board for Opticians, Board for Professional Soil
442 Scientists, Board for Waterworks and Wastewater Works Operators, Real Estate Appraiser Board, Real
443 Estate Board and Board for Waste Management Facility Operators.

444 § 54.1-400. Definitions. **445** As used in this chapter

As used in this chapter unless the context requires a different meaning:

446 "Architect" means a person who, by reason of his knowledge of the mathematical and physical
447 sciences, and the principles of architecture and architectural design, acquired by professional education,
448 practical experience, or both, is qualified to engage in the practice of architecture and whose competence
449 has been attested by the Board through licensure as an architect.

450 The "practice of architecture" means any service wherein the principles and methods of architecture 451 are applied, such as consultation, investigation, evaluation, planning and design, and includes the 452 responsible administration of construction contracts, in connection with any private or public buildings, 453 structures or projects, or the related equipment or accessories.

"Board" means the Board for Architects, Professional Engineers, Land Surveyors, *Certified Interior Designers* and Landscape Architects.

456 "Certified interior designer" means a design professional who meets the criteria of education,
457 experience, and testing in the rendering of interior design services established by the Board through
458 certification as an interior designer.

"Certified landscape architect" means a person who, by reason of his special knowledge of natural,
physical and mathematical sciences, and the principles and methodology of landscape architecture and
landscape architectural design acquired by professional education, practical experience, or both, is
qualified to engage in the practice of landscape architecture and whose competence has been attested by
the Board through certification as a landscape architect.

The "practice of landscape architecture" by a certified landscape architect means any service wherein
the principles and methodology of landscape architecture are applied in consultation, evaluation,
planning (including the preparation and filing of sketches, drawings, plans and specifications) and
responsible supervision or administration of contracts relative to projects principally directed at the
functional and aesthetic use of land.

469 "Improvements to real property" means any valuable addition or amelioration made to land and 470 generally whatever is erected on or affixed to land which is intended to enhance its value, beauty or 471 utility, or adapt it to new or further purposes. Examples of improvements to real property include, but 472 are not limited to, structures, buildings, machinery, equipment, electrical systems, mechanical systems, 473 roads, and water and wastewater treatment and distribution systems.

474 "Interior design" by a certified interior designer means any service rendered wherein the principles 475 and methodology of interior design are applied in connection with the identification, research, and 476 creative solution of problems pertaining to the function and quality of the interior environment. Such 477 services relative to interior spaces shall include the preparation of documents for nonload-bearing interior 478 construction, furnishings, fixtures, and equipment in order to enhance and protect the health, safety, and 479 welfare of the public.

"Land surveyor" means a person who, by reason of his knowledge of the several sciences and of the principles of land surveying, and of the planning and design of land developments acquired by practical
experience and formal education, is qualified to engage in the practice of land surveying, and whose competence has been attested by the Board through licensure as a land surveyor.

484 The "practice of land surveying" includes surveying of areas for a determination or correction, a 485 description, the establishment or reestablishment of internal and external land boundaries, or the determination of topography, contours or location of physical improvements, and also includes the planning of land and subdivisions thereof. The term "planning of land and subdivisions thereof" shall 486 487 488 include, but not be limited to, the preparation of incidental plans and profiles for roads, streets and 489 sidewalks, grading, drainage on the surface, culverts and erosion control measures, with reference to 490 existing state or local standards.

491 "Professional engineer" means a person who is qualified to practice engineering by reason of his 492 special knowledge and use of mathematical, physical and engineering sciences and the principles and 493 methods of engineering analysis and design acquired by engineering education and experience, and 494 whose competence has been attested by the Board through licensure as a professional engineer.

495 The "practice of engineering" means any service wherein the principles and methods of engineering 496 are applied to, but are not necessarily limited to, the following areas: consultation, investigation, 497 evaluation, planning and design of public or private utilities, structures, machines, equipment, processes, transportation systems and work systems, including responsible administration of construction contracts. The term "practice of engineering" shall not include the service or maintenance of existing electrical or 498 499 500 mechanical systems.

501 "Responsible charge" means the direct control and supervision of the practice of architecture, 502 professional engineering, or land surveying.

503 § 54.1-403. Board members and officers; quorum.

504 A. The Board for Architects, Professional Engineers, Land Surveyors, Certified Interior Designers 505 and Landscape Architects shall be composed of thirteen members as follows: three architects, three 506 professional engineers, three land surveyors, two certified landscape architects and two certified interior 507 designers. However, the two certified interior designer members initially appointed to the Board shall be 508 qualified for certification pursuant to this chapter. Each interior designer appointment to the Board may 509 be made from nominations submitted by the Council of Certified Virginia Interior Designers, who shall 510 nominate three persons for each interior designer vacancy. In no case shall the Governor be bound to 511 make any appointment from the nominees.

512 Board members shall have actively practiced or taught their professions for at least ten years prior to 513 their appointments. The terms of Board members shall be four years unless otherwise provided in 514 subsection B.

515 The Board shall elect a president and vice-president from its membership.

516 Eight Board members, consisting of two engineers, two architects, two land surveyors, one certified 517 landscape architect and one interior designer, shall constitute a quorum.

518 B. I. Of the 1998 appointments, the terms shall be as follows: the landscape architect shall serve a 519 one-year term, one interior designer shall serve a two-year term and one interior designer shall serve a 520 four-year term. Of the 2000 appointments, the terms shall be as follows: one architect shall serve a 521 three-year term, one architect shall serve a four-year term, one professional engineer shall serve a 522 two-year term, one professional engineer shall serve a four-year term, one land surveyor shall serve a 523 two-year term, and one land surveyor shall serve a three-year term. Of the 2001 appointments, the 524 terms shall be as follows: the architect shall serve a four-year term, the professional engineer shall 525 serve a four-year term, the land surveyor shall serve a three-year term, and the landscape architect 526 shall serve a four-year term.

527 2. Any appointments to a term of less than four years as specified in subdivision 1 shall not be 528 considered a full term pursuant to § 54.1-107. 529

§ 54.1-407. Land surveying.

530 Notwithstanding the provisions of any regulation promulgated by the Board for Architects, 531 Professional Engineers, Land Surveyors, Certified Interior Designers and Landscape Architects, a land 532 surveyor shall not be required by Board regulations to set corner monumentation or perform a boundary 533 survey on any property when (i) corner monumentation has been set or is otherwise required to be set 534 pursuant to the provisions of a local subdivision ordinance as mandated by § 15.1-465 15.2-2240 or 535 subdivision 7 of subsection A of $\frac{15.1-466}{5}$ \$ 15.2-2241, or where the placing of such monumentation is 536 covered by a surety bond, cash escrow, set-aside letter, letter of credit, or other performance guaranty, or 537 (ii) the purpose of the survey is to determine the location of the physical improvements on the said 538 property only, if the prospective mortgagor or legal agent ordering the survey agrees in writing that such 539 corner monumentation shall not be provided in connection with any such physical improvements survey. 540 The provisions of this section shall apply only to property located within the Counties of Arlington, 541 Fairfax, King George, Loudoun, Prince William, Spotsylvania and Stafford; and the Cities of Alexandria, 542 Fairfax, Falls Church, Fredericksburg, Manassas and Manassas Park.
