11 12	WHEREAS, the National Public Health Service reports that people between the ages of 15 and 24
12	are at a special risk of developing behaviors that may later become permanent health hazards; and
13 14	WHEREAS, research demonstrates that youth problem behaviors are linked to specific, identifiable
15	risk factors and can be prevented; and
16	WHEREAS, an ongoing measurement protocol for these health risk behaviors must be established in
17	order to accurately monitor the incidence and prevalence of problem behaviors among Virginia's youth;
18	and
19	WHEREAS, up-to-date statistics describing youth risk behavior are needed in every locality to
20	accurately plan and evaluate the impact of prevention programs; and
21	WHEREAS, a youth risk-behavior survey administered in 1993 to 1,923 students in 35 Virginia high
22	schools by the Department of Education provided localities with a preliminary snapshot of youth
23	involvement in problem behaviors; and
24	WHEREAS, the survey was discontinued by the Department of Education in 1994; and
25	WHEREAS, in 1997, the Virginia Congress of Parents and Teachers endorsed the assessment of
26 27	youth-risk behaviors "provided that it protects the privacy of students, allows parents/guardians the
<sup>2</sup> / <sub>28</sub>	right to opt-out their students, and participation is voluntary"; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Department of Education be
20 29	requested to administer a youth risk-behavior survey in all localities of the Commonwealth and report
<b>3</b> 0	the results of the survey and the Department's recommendations to the Governor and the General
31	Assembly by November 1, 1999, as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated
32	Systems for the processing of legislative documents.
