6	Requesting the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission to study the effectiveness of Virginia's
7	health regulatory boards.
8	WHEREAS, Virginia's health regulatory boards regulate a number of professions, including medicine,
9	osteopathy, chiropractic, podiatry, physical therapy, occupational therapy, respiratory therapy, pharmacy,
10	nursing, dentistry, the practice of physician assistants, and other health professions; and
11	WHEREAS, the activities of the health regulatory boards are intense, requiring significant
12	disciplinary investigations and hearings, as well as the processing of applications for licensure; and
13	WHEREAS, the advent and growth of the managed care industry has resulted and will continue to
14	result in significant changes in the paradigm of health care; and
15	WHEREAS, the health regulatory boards' authority to regulate remains more administrative and
16	quasi-judicial than focused on quality assurance; and
17	WHEREAS, the time and resources of the health regulatory boards may be becoming stretched to
18	meet their extensive disciplinary case load; and
19 20	WHEREAS, because of the limits on time and resources, the health regulatory boards' ability to
20 21	provide careful and in-depth evaluation of their disciplinary cases, while providing a licensure program
²¹ 22	designed to ensure that Virginia has high quality practitioners, may be taxed; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Joint Legislative Audit and
$\frac{22}{23}$	Review Commission be requested to study the effectiveness of Virginia's health regulatory boards. In its
23 24	study, the Commission shall include: (i) an evaluation of the composition of the respective boards to
25	determine their appropriateness vis-?-vis the evolving duties and responsibilities for health profession
26	regulation; (ii) an assessment of the respective boards' appropriate roles in ensuring the qualifications of
27	physicians and other health care professionals in this Commonwealth; and (iii) an evaluation of the
28	respective boards' authority and activities to establish standards for high quality health care delivery by
29	physicians and other health professionals in Virginia.
30	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Commission, upon request.
31	The Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall complete its work in time to submit its
