10	WHEREAS, Fairfax County is the fifth largest business district in the nation, larger than San Diego,
11	New Orleans, and St. Louis; and
12	WHEREAS, the towns of Reston and Herndon combined currently have 20 million square feet of
13	office space with vacancy rates under four percent; and
14	WHEREAS, the largest number of new corporations, relocations and expansions in Fairfax County
15	are in the Dulles Corridor; and
16	WHEREAS, the Dulles Corridor has been recognized as the "Netplex" and the "Silicon Valley of the
17	East" with the second largest concentration of information technology companies; and
18	WHEREAS, the Washington Dulles International Airport serves 30,000 passengers each day, with 50
19 20	percent of these passenger having the Dulles Corridor as their final destination; and
20 21	WHEREAS, the Washington Dulles International Airport is the second largest transatlantic gateway on the East Coast and the third largest gateway to the Pacific Rim; and
$\frac{21}{22}$	WHEREAS, the Commonwealth needs a continued long-term presence in one of its fastest-growing
$\frac{22}{23}$	and economically prosperous regions; now, therefore, be it
2 4	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Virginia Economic
25	Development Partnership be requested to study the need for a visitor's center in the Dulles Corridor of
26	Fairfax County. As part of the study, the Virginia Economic Development Partnership shall examine the
27	feasibility of financing the visitor's center in the Dulles Corridor through a public-private partnership.
28	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Virginia Economic Development
29	Partnership for this study, upon request.
30	The Virginia Economic Development Partnership shall complete its work in time to submit its
31	findings and recommendations to the Governor and the 1999 Session of the General Assembly as
32	provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of
33	legislative documents.

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
