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1	HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 211
2	Offered January 26, 1998
3	Requesting the House Committee on Agriculture to study the establishment of a poultry indemnity fund.

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9	WHEREAS, avian influenza has the ability to devastate the Delmarva peninsula's poultry industry;
10	and WHEDEAS with the encoding threat for avian influence a ranid rise of action becomes more
11 12	WHEREAS, with the ongoing threat for avian influenza, a rapid plan of action becomes more important every day; and
13	WHEREAS, poultry personnel throughout the United States are taking action to prevent introduction
14	of the disease into their flocks and to deal with the disease should it appear; and
15	WHEREAS, for many years, the states of Maryland and Delaware have had the authority to order
16	poultry and livestock destroyed to stop the spread of disease and were required to indemnify the owners
17 18	of the birds or livestock; and WHEREAS, new agreements in Maryland and Delaware between the states and the industry allow a
19	quick and decisive response should a poultry disease such as avian influenza reach the Delmarva
20	peninsula's poultry industry; and
21	WHEREAS, such agreements provide the following indemnification scheme: each of the six poultry
22	companies located on the Delmarva peninsula is responsible for a yearly maximum of \$100,000, a fund
23 24	of \$2.5 million created by the six companies is available, and each state will also contribute up to five million dollars; and
24 25	WHEREAS, creation of a poultry indemnity fund requires careful consideration of administrative,
26	fiscal, and policy issues; now, therefore, be it
27	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the House Committee on
28	Agriculture be requested to study the establishment of a poultry indemnity fund.
29 30	The Division of Legislative Services shall provide staff support for the study. Technical assistance shall be provided by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. All agencies of the
31	Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Committee, upon request.
32	The House Committee on Agriculture shall complete its work in time to submit its findings and
33	recommendations to the Governor and the 1999 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the
34	procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative
35 36	documents. Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint
38	study.
37 38	Rules Committee. The Committee may withhold expenditures or delay the period for the conduct of the study.
