Patrons-Plum, Almand, Diamonstein, May and Scott; Senator: Howell 8 Referred to Committee on Rules 9 10 WHEREAS, the ability of American workers, inventors, and entrepreneurs to innovate has fueled the 11 American economy since this nation was founded; and WHEREAS, the 21st Century is fast approaching and the United States faces increasing international 12 competition in the world marketplace; and 13 14 WHEREAS, continued leadership by the United States in technology and science is critical to 15 improving the lives of all Americans and ensuring that we can compete in the new global marketplace; 16 and 17 WHEREAS, the development and deployment of new technology are essential to the well-being of the United States and provide the means for long-term economic growth, for a better standard of living 18 19 for all Americans, and for government to better serve its constituents; and 20 WHEREAS, the people, businesses, and universities of the United States, as well as the federal 21 government and state governments, have the capacity to improve the system in the United States of 22 moving new technologies from research and development to competitive products in the world 23 marketplace: and 24 WHEREAS, the states have a critical role in creating the conditions that promote and support the 25 innovation process, as investors in and users of technology and science; and 26 WHEREAS, strengthening our nation's technology and science enterprises will require building new 27 partnerships between the states and the federal government; and 28 WHEREAS, the National Governors Association, the Secretary of Commerce for the United States, 29 and the White House established the United States Innovation Partnership (USIP) in 1997 to facilitate 30 these partnerships; and 31 WHEREAS, the National Governors Association has asked each state's governor to become a 32 participating member of the USIP or to designate a representative to the USIP; and WHEREAS, to date, 27 governors have designated a representative from their states to be participating members of the USIP, but Virginia is not among them; and 33 34 35 WHEREAS, the USIP provides a forum for the states to work closely with the federal government to 36 better utilize technology and science resources to support technology-intensive, state-based economic 37 growth: and 38 WHEREAS, the USIP facilitates collaboration between the states and high-level officials from federal 39 agencies with technology and science missions to create an environment that promotes innovation, 40 creates new jobs, and helps to advance 21st century technologies; and 41 WHEREAS, the USIP seeks to build strategic partnerships among state governments, the federal 42 government, industry, and universities and to define and expand the role of the states in the national 43 technology and science system; and 44 WHEREAS, the USIP also seeks to maximize the return on public and private sector investments in 45 technology and to support development and commercialization of new products and processes; and WHEREAS, under the USIP, the White House and federal agencies will designate liaisons to work 46 47 with states on such issues as removing barriers to the adoptions of new technologies in such areas as **48** telemedicine, environmental technologies, and the building and construction industries, and developing 49 programs to stimulate technology and investments in rural areas and in states that traditionally receive 50 less federal research funding; and 51 WHEREAS, these liaisons will also work with states to address the technical, legal, and other issues 52 associated with the expansion of electronic commerce and expand the capacity of the manufacturing 53 extension partnership to help modernize the nation's 380,000 small-sized and medium-sized 54 manufacturers; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That it is the sense of the General 55 Assembly that His Excellency, the Governor of the Commonwealth, support the work of the United 56 States Innovation Partnership. The Governor is encouraged to [forthwith become explore the advantages 57 of becoming] a participating governor in the USIP or to designate a representative to participate in his 58 59 place on behalf of the Commonwealth of Virginia; and, be it
