13	WHEREAS, on March 25, 1821, Greece began its struggle for independence from nearly four
14	centuries of political domination by the Ottoman Empire; and
15 16	WHEREAS, nearly a decade later, the Hellenic Republic won its independence and has since joined with the United States and other nations in colobrating the form of government created by the engine
16 17	with the United States and other nations in celebrating the form of government created by the ancient Greeks over 2,000 years ago; and
18	WHEREAS, as the inventor of democracy and the home of much of the western world's greatest
10 19	literature, art, and philosophy, the nation of Greece has profoundly influenced western civilization for

2 0 2 1	WHEREAS, it is entirely appropriate that Virginia, birthplace of American democracy, join with the
22	United States and the other freedom-loving nations of the world in celebrating the anniversary of the
23	rebirth of democracy in the country where it was born; now, therefore, be it

25	designate March 25, in 1998 and in each succeeding year, as Greek Independence Day in Virginia; and,
